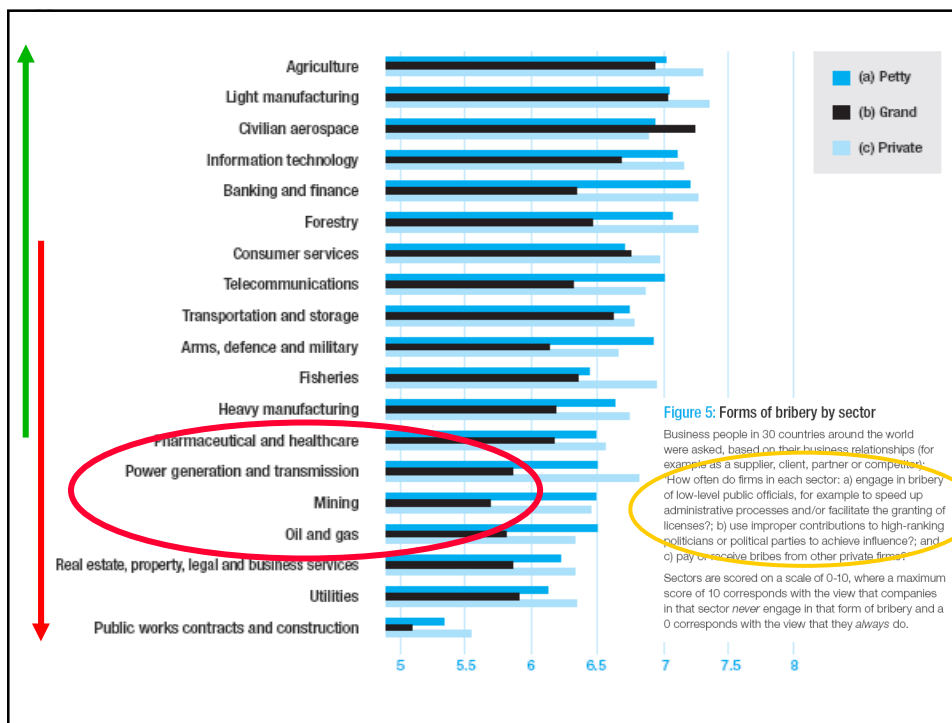
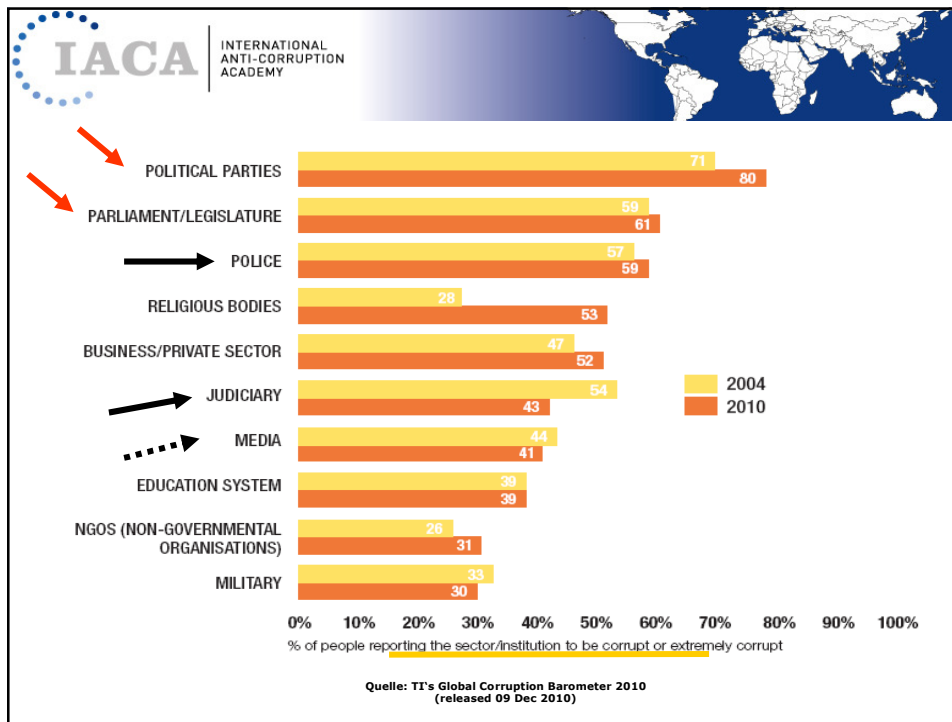
- **Bribes paid globally:**

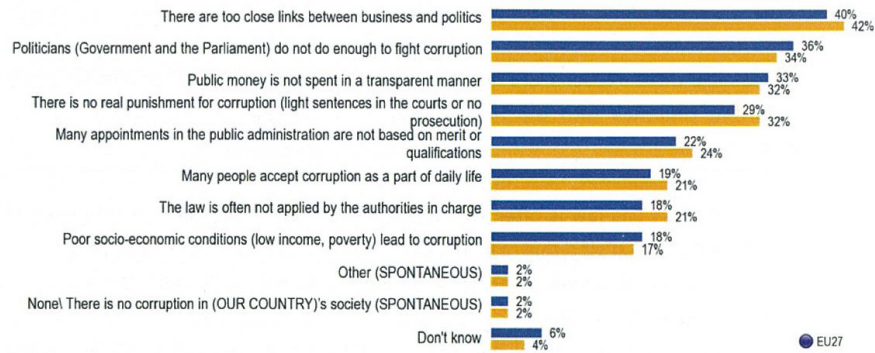
