June to December, proMENTE Social Research and Red Cross Vakuf-Uskoplie completed two separate projects on social cohesion transfer of through knowledge on basic research skills and active role of CSOs monitoring implementing social cohesion activities. The activities resulted in 11 CSOs from across BiH adopting basic research skills applied through three pilot social cohesion perception surveys.
