COMPLIANCE OF EIA WITH THE AARHUS CONVENTION PRINCIPLES


The Centers provide expertise on the compliance of the EIA with the Convention standards with the goal to ensure economic development and environmental safety.

The cooperation with the MNP was very effective on re-considering the mine project.





The Aarhus Centre supports research activities, provides access to environmental data-base and conducts trainings for the local population.










ACs supported communites to raise financial resources for green projects, including on: climate change adaptation, energy saving, nature protection, eco & clean industry, etc.


