


# **Daily Report 216/2019**

12 September 2019<sup>1</sup>

#### **Summary**

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire • violations in Donetsk region and more in Luhansk region.
- A man was injured due to a mine explosion near Ternove and a woman was injured due to shelling in Roza.
- Inside the Stanytsia Luhanska disengagement area, the Mission saw workers from government-controlled areas conduct demining and clearing debris north of and near the broken section of the bridge and workers from non-government-controlled areas conduct demining activities and repairs to the metal section of the bridge.
- The SMM recorded ceasefire violations inside the Zolote disengagement area. •
- SMM long-range unmanned aerial vehicle spotted trains transporting probable coal wagons and fuel tanks in and near non-government-controlled Voznesenivka, near the border with the Russian Federation.
- The SMM monitored adherence to the ceasefire to facilitate repairs to essential ٠ civilian infrastructure, including power lines near Travneve and Holmivskyi.
- Restrictions of the Mission's access continued, including at a border crossing point • near Dovzhanske and at checkpoints in Petrivske and Zaichenko, all in nongovernment-controlled areas.\*



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including, however, more explosions (about 75), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (11 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including the majority of explosions, were recorded at easterly and south-easterly directions of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk) and at easterly directions of Hnutove (government-controlled, 20km north-east of Mariupol).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations, including more explosions (15), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (three explosions). The majority of the ceasefire violations were recorded in and near the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below) and in areas north-north-east of Holubivske (non-government-controlled, 51km west of Luhansk).

## Man injured due to mine explosion near Ternove and woman injured due to shelling in Roza

The SMM followed up on reports of a man injured on 5 September due to a mine explosion about 3km north-north-west of Ternove (non-government-controlled, 15km south-east of Luhansk). On 8 September, at a hospital in Luhansk city (non-government-controlled), the SMM saw a man (aged 39) whose left leg had been amputated just below the knee (which was covered by a bandage). He told the SMM that in the morning of 5 September an explosive device had detonated while he was collecting hay with a friend near a local road. On 10 September, medical staff at the same hospital told the SMM that the man underwent surgery on 5 September (due to injuries consistent with a mine explosion) during which part of his leg was amputated.

The SMM followed up on reports of a woman injured on 6 September due to shelling in Roza (non-government-controlled, 89km south of Donetsk). At a hospital in Novoazovsk (non-government-controlled, 40km east of Mariupol), the SMM saw a woman (aged 61) with burn injuries on both hands (one was bandaged). The woman told the SMM that she suffered burn injuries to her hands and legs in the early morning of 6 September while escaping her burning house, adding that her house, yard and car had been destroyed due to shelling (see <u>SMM Daily Report 11 September 2019</u> for damage from shelling to her and other houses in Roza). Medical staff at the hospital told the SMM that the woman had been admitted on 6 September with second- and third- degree burns on her legs and hands.

#### Stanytsia Luhanska disengagement area

In the early morning of 11 September, the SMM saw 12 members of the State Emergency Service (SES) and six workers from government-controlled areas enter the disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska (government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk). Shortly thereafter, the SMM saw the same workers (with a crane and dump truck) remove damaged cement from electricity poles and load it into a dump truck, about 500m north of the broken section of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north of Luhansk). The SMM also saw SES deminers use metal detectors in the area under the broken section of the bridge (on the eastern and western sides of it). It saw workers from government-controlled areas (with a tractor) collect scrap metal and other debris, in the area under the broken section of the bridge (on its eastern side). In the late morning of 11 September, the SMM saw workers from government-controlled areas (with one van) clear vegetation on the eastern edge of the road, about 250m north of the broken section of the bridge (on its eastern side). In the late morning of 11 September, the SMM saw workers from government-controlled areas (with one van) clear vegetation on the eastern edge of the road, about 250m north of the broken section of the bridge.

The SMM observed that the shuttle bus and a golf cart continued operating between the entry-exit checkpoint of the Ukrainian Armed Forces and the broken section of the bridge and back.

In the afternoon of 10 September, the SMM saw nine members of the armed formations clean the area at the base and around the broken section of the bridge. In the morning of 11 September, the SMM saw three deminers from non-government-controlled areas collect wood in areas east and west of the broken section of the bridge. In the afternoon of 11 September, the SMM saw black smoke rise from the western side of the southern edge of the broken section of the bridge and one member of the armed formations leave the area.

On the same morning, the SMM saw at least two deminers from non-government-controlled areas use metal detectors and clear vegetation on the southern side of the river bank, about 100m north of the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the bridge. The SMM also saw two workers from non-government-controlled areas with green uniforms (using a generator and <u>previously installed</u> scaffolding) weld metal components on the upper part of the metal section of the bridge (on its northern edge).

On 11 September, the SMM saw nine members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) between the broken section of the bridge and the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the bridge.<sup>4</sup> It observed that the blue container (see SMM Daily Report 26 August 2019) and a brown container (see SMM Daily Report 9 September 2019) (respectively about 50m south and 150m south of the broken section of the bridge) and a concrete construction (around 20m north-north-west of the checkpoint of the armed formations and around 300m south-south-east of the broken section of the bridge) were still in place.

In the afternoon of 11 September, positioned respectively about 100m north and 500m south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge, two SMM patrols heard five shots and two bursts of smallarms fire at an assessed range of 500m north-north-east and 1km north-north-west, respectively, assessed as inside the disengagement area.

#### Other disengagement areas<sup>5</sup>

On 10 September, an SMM mid-range unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted a new 55mlong trench (not seen in imagery from 19 July 2019) running south-west from the garden of a residential house in Katerynivka (government-controlled, 64km west of Luhansk), inside the disengagement area near Zolote.

On the night of 10-11 September, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded six projectiles in flight, at an assessed range of 2-4km south-east, assessed as inside the disengagement area,

an undetermined explosion at an assessed range of 3-5km east-south-east (unable to assess whether inside or outside the disengagement area) and 13 projectiles in flight, at an assessed range of 3-8km east and south-south-west, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within its 5km periphery.

Positioned close to the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), the Mission observed a calm situation.\*

#### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

On 8 September, the Mission observed seven weapons in violation of withdrawal lines (see the below tables for weapons in violation of withdrawal lines and weapons observed beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites).

#### Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone<sup>6</sup>

Government-controlled areas 10 September

An SMM mini-UAV spotted:

 a trench digger (PZM-2) and an anti-aircraft gun (ZU-23, 23mm) mounted on a truck under camouflage netting next to a civilian house on the south-eastern outskirts and three infantry fighting vehicles (IFV) (BMP-2) on the north-eastern outskirts of Krasnohorivka (21km west of Donetsk).

An SMM mid-range UAV spotted an armoured combat vehicle (ACV) near Katerynivka.

11 September

The SMM saw:

- an armoured personnel carrier (BTR variant) near Nyzhnia Vilkhova (27km north-east of Luhansk).

#### Non-government-controlled areas

10 September

An SMM mini-UAV spotted an IFV (BMP-2) near Vesela Hora (16km north of Luhansk).

#### 11 September

The SMM saw:

- two military-type trucks with trench digging equipment and a crane (mounted on a truck) operating in a field (and heard a heavy machine vehicle operating about 200m from the road) about 2km north of Petrivske; and
- a trench, seen for the first time, and four members of the armed formations next to it, about 150m south of the southern edge of the Zolote disengagement area.

#### Presence of anti-tank mines near Shchastia and Vesela Hora

On 10 September, an SMM mini-UAV again spotted at least 39 anti-tank mines laid in three rows across road H-21 south of the bridge in Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk), assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces. The UAV also again spotted four anti-tank mines (TM-62) laid across the same road near Vesela Hora (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk).

#### SMM facilitation of repairs to and the operation of civilian infrastructure

The SMM monitored adherence to the ceasefire to enable repairs to power lines in Spartak (non-government-controlled, 9km north of Donetsk), near Dolomitne (53km north-east of Donetsk), Travneve (government-controlled, 51km north-east of Donetsk) and Holmivskyi (non-government-controlled, 49km north-east of Donetsk) and to the sewage system near Novoluhanske (government-controlled, 53km north-east of Donetsk). Positioned in Holmivskyi, the SMM heard an explosion 1-3km north-east assessed as a controlled detonation of unexploded ordnance (UXO).

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (15km north of Donetsk) and monitor the security situation around the pumping station near Vasylivka (non-government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk).

#### Border areas not under government control

On the night of 10-11 September, an SMM long-range UAV spotted about 35 trucks and 40 smaller vehicles lined up at a border crossing point near Voznesenivka (non-government-controlled, 65km south-east of Luhansk).

On the same night, the UAV spotted a train pulling eight cars (assessed as probable fuel tankers) traveling north-west from the direction of the border and approaching the train station in Voznesenivka. The UAV also spotted a second train in the vicinity pulling 14 cars, traveling east to west and entering the train station. At the train station in Voznesenivka, the same UAV spotted a third train carrying about 50 empty probable coal wagons, leaving the train station and traveling east towards the border.

While at a border crossing point near Dovzhanske (84km south-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw four cars (three with Russian Federation licence plates and one with "LPR" plates), a bus (with "DPR" plates) and a truck with covered cargo (with Ukrainian licence plates) entering Ukraine. It also saw four cars (three with Russian Federation and one with Georgian licence plates), and three trucks with covered cargo (one with Ukrainian licence plates and two with "LPR plates") exiting Ukraine. After about 15 minutes, a member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area.\*

While at a pedestrian border crossing point near Novoborovytsi (79km south of Luhansk) for about 15 minutes, the SMM saw no pedestrians enter or exit Ukraine. The SMM observed a newly installed barbed wire fence through the eastern flank of the border, leading east toward the border with the Russian Federation.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

### \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, UXO and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the JCCC should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see below). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint in Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage, citing "demining activities in the area".
- At a checkpoint 800m north of Zaichenko (non-government-controlled, 26km northeast of Mariupol), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage southward to Sakhanka (non-government-controlled, 24km north-east of Mariupol), citing "ongoing demining activities".
- At a border crossing point near Dovzhanske (non-government-controlled, 84km south-east of Luhansk) an armed member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area.

*Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:* 

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access to disengagement areas near Zolote and Petrivske, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines and UXO.

#### Delay:

- At a checkpoint west of Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-governmentcontrolled, 29km north-east of Mariupol), an armed member of the armed formations <u>again</u> allowed the SMM to proceed only after about 20 minutes of waiting.

#### Conditional access:

- At a checkpoint near Novoazovsk (non-government-controlled, 40km east of Mariupol), a member of the armed formations allowed the SMM to proceed to the settlement only while accompanied by a member of the armed formations.

#### Other impediments:

- On the night of 10-11 September, an SMM long-range UAV lost its GPS signal due to signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Stepanivka (government-controlled, 54km north of Donetsk).<sup>7</sup>


