
Daily Report 71/2020

25 March 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske.
- The SMM saw that the entry-exit checkpoint near Maiorsk and three checkpoints of the armed formations along the contact line in both Donetsk and Luhansk region remained closed.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable demining activities near Krasnyi Yar and Vyskryva, as well as repairs to power lines near Maiorsk.
- Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement continued, including at checkpoints of the armed formations near Stanytsia Luhanska, where members of the armed formations denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas of Luhansk region.*

Ceasefire violations²





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations, including more explosions (42), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (17 explosions). The majority of the ceasefire violations were recorded at westerly directions of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk) and at northerly directions of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations, including more explosions (about 290), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 60 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded in areas south-west of Staryi Aidar (government-controlled, 20km north-west of Luhansk), including about 240 explosions.

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁵

On 24 March, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission saw six members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) between the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk) and their checkpoint south of it.

On the evening of 23 March, the SMM camera in Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) recorded two undetermined explosions, 18 projectiles in flight and an illumination flare, all at an assessed range of 3-6km east and assessed as **outside the disengagement area near Zolote** but within 5km of its periphery. Throughout the day, the SMM saw four members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) on the southern edge of the disengagement area.

On the evening and night of 23 March, the SMM cameras in Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) and in Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) recorded a total of eight projectiles in flight, assessed as **inside the disengagement area near Petrivske**. On 24 March, positioned at two locations near the disengagement area, the SMM observed a calm situation.*

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum (for further details, see the table below).

The Mission saw tanks beyond their withdrawal line but outside designated storage areas in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region.

Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone⁶

The Mission observed armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas (for further details, see the table below).

Preventive measures against COVID-19 outbreak

On 24 March, the Mission saw that the entry-exit checkpoint near Maiorsk (government-controlled, 45km north-east of Donetsk) and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Horlivka, as well as a checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) remained closed with no traffic in either direction. Additionally, at the checkpoint near Horlivka, the SMM saw for the first time a wire barrier with a mine hazard sign on it (a red square with "Stop, Mines" written on it in Cyrillic) blocking the road and preventing further passage. At the checkpoint near Olenivka, the SMM saw barriers across both lanes of road H-20 and preventing further passage.

On two occasions, on the morning on 24 March at a checkpoint of the armed formations 200m south of Stanytsia Luhanska bridge, members of the armed formations denied an SMM foot patrol passage towards government-controlled areas of Luhansk region.*

SMM facilitation of repairs to critical civilian infrastructure and demining activities

The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable repairs to power lines near Maiorsk, as well as demining activities near Krasnyi Yar (non-government-controlled, 12km north-east of Luhansk) and Vyskryva (government-controlled, 76km west of Luhansk).

The SMM continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (15km north of Donetsk).

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro and Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example see SMM Daily Report 24 March 2020). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint 200m south of Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), members of the armed formations denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas on two occasions, citing, respectively, "new instructions from superiors" and "that instructions must be issued from another agency".

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:

- Two SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicles experienced signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near and inside the disengagement area close to Petrivske.⁷



⁹ The table only includes ceasefire violations directly observed by the SMM patrols or recorded by the SMM cameras and it may include those also assessed to be live-fire exercises, controlled detonations, etc. Details provided – in terms of distance, direction, weapons-type, etc. – are based on assessments provided by monitors on the ground and technical monitoring officers, and are not always necessarily precise. When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs, and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff has temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and patrols in this settlement during daylight hours, as well).
