


# Daily Report 83/2020

## 8 April 2020<sup>1</sup>

#### **Summary**

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire • violations in Donetsk region and more in Luhansk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage towards non-٠ government-controlled areas of Donetsk region at a checkpoint near Olenivka.\*
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia • Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske. It continued to observe anti-tank mines inside the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The SMM monitored and facilitated adherence to localized ceasefires to enable • repairs to and maintenance and construction of civilian infrastructure on both sides of the contact line, as well as to enable demining activities in Krasnyi Yar, Luhansk region.
- The Mission again saw that two entry-exit checkpoints and their corresponding checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions remained closed amid the COVID-19 outbreak.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.\*



#### Ceasefire violations<sup>2</sup>



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including, however, a similar number of explosions (about 65), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 60 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including about half of the explosions, were recorded within a 5km radius around the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) and at south-westerly directions of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded a five-fold increase in the number of ceasefire violations, including about 80 explosions, compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 30 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded in areas northeast, south-east and south-west of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below).

Members of the armed formations continued to deny SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line in Donetsk region

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk region. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.<sup>5</sup>

At a checkpoint near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations again denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, citing "orders from superiors" related to COVID-19.\*

#### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>6</sup>

On 7 April, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (governmentcontrolled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), while positioned about 150m north-west of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission saw a non-SMM unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flying from north to south above its position.

On the same day, while positioned at six locations around the **disengagement area near Zolote**, the SMM heard about 45 undetermined explosions and 60 bursts of small-arms and heavy-machine-gun fire, all assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

The same day, inside the disengagement area, about 350m north of its southern edge, the SMM <u>again</u> saw five wooden logs lying across road T-1316, as well as two concrete blocks with a sign (with "Quarantine" written in Cyrillic on it) atop one of them on the edge of the road. Throughout the day, the SMM saw two members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near the southern edge of the disengagement area.

Outside of the reporting period, on 22 March, an SMM mid-range UAV again spotted 100 anti-tank mines inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-

controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), about 150m south of its northern edge (for previous observations in the area, see <u>SMM Daily Report 18 December 2019</u>).<sup>7</sup> Outside the disengagement area, the UAV also again spotted 15 anti-tank mines about 500m north of the disengagement area's northern edge and four mine signs lying on the ground, about 40m north of a road between Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) and Viktorivka (non-government-controlled, 42km south-west of Donetsk). All mines were assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces. (For previous observation in the area, see <u>SMM Daily Report 21 March 2020</u>.)

On 4 April, inside the disengagement area near Petrivske, on its northern edge, an SMM mini-UAV again spotted about 140 anti-tank mines running south for about 350m. Outside the disengagement area, the UAV again spotted about 125 anti-tank mines (TM-62M) laid in a field near the aforementioned road between Bohdanivka and Viktorivka. All mines were assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces. (For previous observations in the area, see above and <u>SMM Daily Report 27 March 2020</u>.)

On 4 April, outside the disengagement area, an SMM mini-UAV again spotted about 80 anti-tank mines (TM-62M) starting about 30m west of the area's western edge and extending north for about 150m. (For previous observations in the area, see <u>SMM Daily Report 6</u> <u>March 2020</u>.)

On the evening of 6 April, the SMM camera 2km east of Bohdanivka recorded a projectile in flight at an assessed range of 3.5-4km east-south-east, assessed as inside the disengagement area.

On 7 April, while positioned 2km north of Petrivske, the SMM heard seven shots of smallarms fire at an assessed range of 1-2km south-south-east, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

#### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

#### Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone<sup>8</sup>

The SMM observed military and military-type presence in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, including in residential areas (for further details, see the table below).

On 7 April, while positioned in Krasnyi Yar (non-government-controlled, 12km north-east of Luhansk) to monitor adherence to localized ceasefires to enable demining activities, the SMM observed a grey non-SMM UAV flying over its position on two occasions.

#### Presence of mines near non-government-controlled Styla

On 22 March, an SMM mid-range UAV <u>again</u> spotted seven anti-tank mines in a field about 4km south-west of Styla (non-government-controlled, 34km south of Donetsk), assessed as belonging to the armed formations.<sup>9</sup>

# SMM facilitation of operation, construction, maintenance of and repairs to critical civilian infrastructure and demining activities

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk), repairs to water infrastructure in Krasnyi Lyman (non-government-controlled, 30km north-west of Luhansk) and in Pankivka (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk), and water wells in Raivka (non-government-controlled, 16km north-west of Luhansk); the construction of a power line near the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) close to Maiorsk (government-controlled, 45km north-east of Donetsk) and demining activities in Krasnyi Yar.

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. On the evening of 6 April, the SMM camera at the DFS recorded 16 projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 0.5-1km south. On the following day, while positioned at three locations near the DFS, the SMM heard and saw ceasefire violations including four impacts of undetermined weapons and about 125 bursts and shots of heavy-machine-gun and small-arms fire. All these ceasefire violations were assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS.

#### Measures at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints to counter COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM saw that the EECP near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka remained closed.\*

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed.

#### Border areas outside government control

While at a border crossing point near Uspenka (73km south-east of Donetsk) for about an hour, the SMM saw 14 covered cargo trucks (six with Russian Federation licence plates and eight with "DPR" plates) and nine pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) entering Ukraine, and five pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) exiting Ukraine.

While at the border crossing point near Marynivka (78km east of Donetsk) for about 15 minutes, the SMM observed no traffic entering Ukraine and a covered cargo truck (with "DPR" plates) exiting Ukraine.

While at a border crossing point near Ulianivske (61km south-east of Donetsk) for about 20 minutes, the SMM again saw that the border crossing point continued to be closed.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example see <u>SMM Daily</u> <u>Report 28 March 2020</u>). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations again denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, citing "orders from superiors".

#### Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

#### Other impediments:

 An SMM mid-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Vodiane (government-controlled, 94km south of Donetsk).<sup>10</sup>


