
# Daily Report 115/2020

 $\overline{15}$  May 2020<sup>1</sup>

#### **Summary**

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and more in Luhansk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.\*
- The SMM continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske.
- The Mission saw for the first time unexploded ordnance and remnants of ammunition near road T-0504 between Popasna and Molodizhne, Luhansk region.
- The Mission monitored and facilitated adherence to localised ceasefires to enable the
  operation of and repairs to critical civilian infrastructure, including to water pipelines
  and a power substation in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk and Donetsk
  regions.
- The SMM continued following up on the situation of civilians amid the COVID-19 outbreak, including at entry-exit checkpoints and their corresponding checkpoints in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.

#### Ceasefire violations<sup>2</sup>





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 60), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (100 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded in areas south of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) and in areas close to the disengagement area near Petrivske (nongovernment-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) (see below).

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded more ceasefire violations, including more explosions (about 115), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 60 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded in areas south-east of Kriakivka (government-controlled, 38km north-west of Luhansk), including more than 60 explosions of artillery rounds.

# Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line in Donetsk and Luhansk regions

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.<sup>5</sup>

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk), three armed members of the armed formations denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19. The SMM <u>again</u> saw that the road was blocked by metal obstacles and a pile of tyres.\*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19. He added that the Mission would also not be allowed passage in the opposite direction.\*

#### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>6</sup>

Inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw a member of the armed formations (wearing an armband with "JCCC" written on it) near their checkpoint south of the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

On 14 May, while positioned at three locations near **the disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), the SMM heard 13 undetermined explosions assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery. On the same day, the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) standing inside the area on road T-1316 (about 350m north of the area's southern edge).

On 14 May, while positioned at two locations near **the disengagement area near Petrivske**, the SMM heard about 100 bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

#### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

### Presence of unexploded ordnance and anti-personnel mine near Popasna

Near road T-0504 between Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk) and Molodizhne (non-government-controlled, 63km west of Luhansk), the SMM saw for the first time two objects assessed as rockets of a rocket-propelled grenade launcher (RPG-7). One of the rockets (assessed as unexploded) was lying in a field about 30m south of the road near a checkpoint of the Ukrainian Armed Forces; the other (assessed as exploded) was in a tree branch on the road's northern shoulder. Near the latter, about 10m from the road, the Mission again saw an anti-personnel mine (MON-200).

# SMM facilitation of operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to water infrastructure near non-government-controlled Pankivka (16km north of Luhansk) and Krasnyi Lyman (30km north-west of Luhansk), as well as to a transformer substation in the Trudivski area of Donetsk city's Petrovskyi district (non-government-controlled, 15km south-west of Donetsk city centre).

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. While positioned at two locations near the station, the SMM heard undetermined explosions as well as shots and bursts of heavy-machine-gun and small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station (see table below).

# Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoints (EECP) near Maiorsk (government-controlled, 45km north-east of Donetsk), Marinka (government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) and Hnutove (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk), as well as the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations near Oleksandrivka and Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk), remained closed.\*

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed.\*

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 28 March 2020). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19. He added that the Mission would also not be allowed passage in the opposite direction.
- At a checkpoint near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk), three armed members of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.

*Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:* 

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.



When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

(In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff has temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and patrols in this settlement during daylight hours, as well).
