


# Daily Report 121/2020

22 May 20201


### **Summary**

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire ٠ violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at • checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.\*
- The SMM continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, • Zolote and Petrivske.
- The Mission saw weapons in violation of withdrawal lines in government-• controlled areas of Donetsk region.
- It saw anti-tank mines, including some for the first time, near Dokuchaievsk, ٠ Donetsk region.
- The Mission continued following up on measures taken amid the COVID-19 . outbreak, including at entry-exit checkpoints and their corresponding checkpoints in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.\*

### Ceasefire violations<sup>2</sup>









In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 65), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 200 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded near the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) and at southerly directions of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled area, 57km north-east of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 50), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 135 explosions). Almost all ceasefire violations, including almost all explosions, were recorded at north-westerly and southerly directions of Pervomaisk (non-government-controlled area, 58km west of Luhansk) and in areas south-west of Molodizhne (non-government-controlled, 63km west of Luhansk).

# Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line in Donetsk and Luhansk regions

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.<sup>5</sup>

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint west of Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, nongovernment-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to quarantine restrictions due to the COVID-19 outbreak.\*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km northeast of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations (wearing an armband with "JCCC" written on it) <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to quarantine restrictions due to the COVID-19 outbreak.\*

### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>6</sup>

On 21 May, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (governmentcontrolled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) between the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge and their checkpoint south of it.

On 21 May, while positioned on the western edge of Pervomaisk (non-governmentcontrolled, 58km west of Luhansk), the SMM heard an undetermined explosion and eight shots of small-arms fire at an assessed range of 3-8km north-west, assessed as outside the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) but within 5km of its periphery. On the same day, the Mission saw seven members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near the southern edge of the disengagement area, four of whom were walking on road T-1316 inside the disengagement area to about 350m north of its southern edge.

On 20 May, outside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), in a field about 25m from the eastern side of road C-051532 between Styla (non-government-controlled, 34km south of Donetsk) and Petrivske, an SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted a probable mounting bracket of an anti-personnel mine (MON-200), where an anti-vehicle mine (TM-83) was <u>previously</u> <u>observed</u>. About 20m further south, the UAV spotted an anti-personnel mine (MON-200) half-buried in the ground. On 21 May, on the same road, the SMM again saw the aforementioned mine (assessed as MON-200 type) on the eastern shoulder of the road and a wooden box nearby.

On the evening of 20 May, the SMM camera near Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded two projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 1-3km east-south-east and assessed as inside the disengagement area.

On 21 May, while positioned about 2km north of Petrivske, the SMM heard an undetermined explosion at an assessed range of 4-6km west (assessed as outside of the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery).

### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

The Mission saw four weapons in violation of withdrawal lines in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, including near the residential area of Lomakyne (93km south of Donetsk) (for further details, see the tables below).

#### Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone<sup>7</sup>

The SMM observed an anti-aircraft gun and armoured combat vehicles in the security zone in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, including some in residential areas (for further details, see the table below).

On 17 May, an SMM mid-range UAV spotted three craters in fields about 1.3km east of Uzhivka (formerly Leninske, non-government-controlled, 96km south of Donetsk) (not seen in imagery from 19 March 2020). The SMM could not assess the type of weapon or direction of fire.

On 19 May, in fields about 2km south-east of Hnutove (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk), aerial imagery available to the SMM revealed the presence of four new impact craters (not seen in imagery from 12 April 2020). The same imagery also revealed a 25m-long trench extension in fields about 2km west of Uzhivka, assessed as belonging to the armed formations (not seen in imagery from 12 April 2020).

### Mines near Vodiane and Pikuzy, and mine hazard sign in Horlivka

On 17 May, an SMM mid-range UAV spotted about 60 anti-tank mines, part of a larger minefield east of Vodiane (government-controlled, 94km south of Donetsk), assessed as

belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces (for previous observations in the area, see <u>SMM</u> <u>Daily Report 22 April 2020</u>).

The same UAV also spotted about 70 anti-tank mines in a field about 2.5km south of Pikuzy (formerly Kominternove, non-government-controlled, 92km south of Donetsk), assessed as belonging to the armed formations (for previous observations in the area, see <u>SMM Daily Report 14 March 2020</u>).

On 19 May, an SMM mid-range UAV <u>again</u> spotted 20 anti-tank mines in fields about 4km south-west of Dokuchaievsk (non-government-controlled, 30km south-west of Donetsk). The same UAV spotted for the first time 20 and 50 anti-tank mines in fields about 6km and 7km south of Dokuchaievsk, respectively. All these mines are located close to the most forward positions of the armed formations in fields leading to Mykolaivka (government-controlled, 40km south of Donetsk).

On 21 May, the SMM saw for the first time a mine hazard sign – with "Stop mines" written in Cyrillic – on a tree on the eastern edge of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk).

### SMM facilitation of repairs to and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. While positioned at four locations near the DFS, the Mission recorded six undetermined explosions, as well as bursts and shots of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS.

# Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Hnutove and its corresponding checkpoint near Verkhnoshyrokivske, remained closed.\*

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska and its corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed.\*

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, <u>SMM Daily Report 19 May 2020</u>). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk

regions remain restricted following <u>the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb</u>; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

### Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint west of Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-governmentcontrolled, 85km south of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to quarantine restrictions due to the COVID-19 outbreak.
- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to quarantine restrictions due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

### *Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:*

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

### Delay:

- At a checkpoint in Raivka (non-government-controlled, 16km north-west of Luhansk), an armed member of the armed formations allowed the SMM to proceed towards the settlement only after about 30 minutes of waiting.

### Other impediments:

- An SMM mid-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Staromykhailivka (non-government-controlled, 15km west of Donetsk)<sup>8</sup>.


