


Daily Report 131/2020

3 June 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.*
- The Mission continued monitoring all three disengagement areas. It recorded ceasefire violations inside the disengagement area near Petrivske and about 110 ceasefire violations which it was unable to assess as inside or outside the disengagement area.
- The SMM observed persons inside former positions of the Ukrainian Armed Forces and of the armed formations inside the disengagement area near Zolote.
- The SMM saw weapons in violation of withdrawal lines on both sides of the contact line in Luhansk region.
- The Mission continued following up on measures taken amid the COVID-19 outbreak, including at entry-exit checkpoints and checkpoints in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- Members of the armed formations continued to restrict the SMM's freedom of movement, including at checkpoints near Olenivka, Lozove and Stanytsia Luhanska.*



Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (21), compared with the [previous reporting period](#) (about 40 explosions). More than half of the ceasefire violations, including almost half of the explosions, were recorded in areas near and inside the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) (see below) and at northerly directions of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including no explosions, compared with the [previous reporting period](#) (also no explosions). All ceasefire violations were recorded in areas south-south-west of Kriakivka (government-controlled, 38km north-west of Luhansk).

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line in Donetsk and Luhansk regions

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.⁵

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), members of the armed formations (including one visibly armed) [again](#) denied the SMM passage on two occasions, once towards government-controlled areas and the second time towards non-government-controlled areas, both times referring to restrictions due to COVID-19.*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations [again](#) denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

While positioned inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw a member of the armed formations (wearing an armband with "JCCC" written on it) at the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the bridge.

On the night between 31 May-1 June, inside the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), an SMM long-range unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted a person inside a former position of the armed formations about 500m north of the area's southern edge and about 2km west of road T-1316. The UAV also spotted a person inside a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces near the railway track, about 500m west of the area's north-eastern corner.

On 2 June, the Mission saw ten members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near the southern edge of the disengagement area, eight of whom

were walking inside the area along road T-1316 up to about 350m north of its southern edge and later returned to their checkpoint.

On 1 June, outside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**, about 350m north-west of the area's north-eastern corner, an SMM mini-UAV again spotted 16 anti-tank mines, which appeared to have been placed in a cluster after demining activities. About 200m east of the area and about 250m south of Petrivske, the UAV again spotted about 60 anti-tank mines. All of these mines were assessed as belonging to the armed formations (for previous observations, see [SMM Daily Report of 20 May 2020](#)).

On 2 June, while positioned 2km north of Petrivske, the SMM recorded five undetermined explosions and 14 shots and bursts of small-arms and heavy-machine-gun fire, all at an assessed range of 2-3km south-south-west (assessed as inside the disengagement area). On the same day, while positioned at two locations near the disengagement area, the SMM heard about 110 shots of small-arms fire at an assessed range of 1-3km south and south-south-west (unable to be assessed as inside or outside the disengagement area).

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

It observed weapons in violation of withdrawal lines on both sides of the contact line in Luhansk region. The Mission also observed 72 weapons beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites at training areas in non-government-controlled Luhansk region (for further details, see the tables below).

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone⁷

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions (for further details, see the table below).

On 1 June, in a field about 4km north-east of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk) and about 30m south of the road between Popasna and Katerynivka (government-controlled, 64km west of Luhansk), an SMM mini-UAV spotted for the first time a 60m-long trench extension (not seen in imagery from 1 April 2020) running north-east to south-west, assessed as belonging to Ukrainian Armed Forces.

In a field about 2km west-north-west of Molodizhne (non-government-controlled, 63km north-west of Luhansk), the same UAV spotted a new 70m-long trench running east to west, assessed as belonging to the armed formations (not seen in imagery from 1 April 2020).

Demining activities near Myrna Dolyna

On 2 June, about 2km east of Myrna Dolyna (government-controlled, 67km north-west of Luhansk), the SMM saw two vans bearing the logo of an international demining organization and three people in protective gear with metal detectors walking in a field west of road P-66.

SMM facilitation of operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The SMM continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned at two locations near it, the Mission heard three undetermined explosions as well as bursts and shots of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka remained closed and saw no one queuing to travel in either direction.*

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska and its corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed and saw no one queuing to travel in either direction.*

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Dnipro, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

***Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate**

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see [SMM Daily Report 1 June 2020](#)). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following [the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb](#); these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), members of the armed formations (one of them armed) [again](#) denied the SMM passage on two occasions, once towards government-controlled areas and the second time towards non-government-controlled areas, both times referring to quarantine restrictions due to COVID-19.

- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations [again](#) denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/unexploded ordnance (UXO):

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Conditional access:

- At a checkpoint of the armed formations near Lozove (non-government-controlled, 52km north-east of Donetsk), two armed members of the armed formations allowed the SMM to proceed only while escorted by a member of the armed formations, citing "security reasons".

Other impediments:

- On the evening and night between 1-2 June, on four occasions an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as probable jamming, while flying over areas between Marinka (government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) and Styla (non-government-controlled, 34km south of Donetsk), between non-government-controlled Hirne (30km east of Donetsk) and Veselohorivka (64km west of Luhansk), and between government-controlled Zolote (60km west of Luhansk) and Trokhizbenka (32km north-west of Luhansk).⁸
- On 2 June, on two occasions an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near government-controlled Lebedynske (99km south of Donetsk) and Vodiane (94km south of Donetsk).
- On the same day, an SMM mid-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Lebedynske and Pikuzy (formerly Kominternove, non-government-controlled, 92km south of Donetsk).
