
Daily Report 140/2020

13 June 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- Small-arms fire was assessed as directed at an SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle flying over the southern part of Orlivske, Donetsk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.*
- The SMM continued monitoring all three disengagement areas. It observed people in the evening hours near former military and military-type positions inside the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to a localised ceasefire to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove and continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station.
- The Mission saw that the entry-exit checkpoints (EECP) in Stanytsia Luhanska and Marinka were temporarily open but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations remained closed. At both EECPs, the Mission observed people and cars queuing to cross the contact line.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.*

Ceasefire violations²





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 110), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 210 explosions). The majority of the ceasefire violations were recorded in areas south-east of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk), including 85 explosions of artillery rounds (type undetermined), and in areas north and north-north-east of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 70), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 130 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including 60 explosions of artillery rounds (type undetermined), were recorded in areas south-west of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below).

Small-arms fire assessed as directed at SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle near Orlivske

While conducting a mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flight over the southern part of Orlivske (government-controlled, 82km south of Donetsk), the SMM heard 12 shots of small-arms fire at an assessed distance of about 3km south-south-west, assessed as aimed at the UAV, which was flying about 3km south-south-west. The SMM safely landed the UAV and left the area.*

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.⁵

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint west of Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations again denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to quarantine restrictions due to COVID-19.*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

Inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw six members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk). The Mission also saw four workers performing repairs to the roof and a wall of the aforementioned checkpoint and, near a

container of an international organization south of the checkpoint, the SMM saw three workers drilling the ground and delivering a pipe, reportedly for drainage purposes.

On the same day, inside the disengagement area, the SMM saw three vehicles and 16 members of an international organization, driving from the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) of the Ukrainian Armed Forces to the northern edge of the new section of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge. The SMM saw the people unload cargo from the trucks and carry it to the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the bridge, where nine members of the international organization waited and loaded the cargo into six vehicles.

Also on 12 June, while on the eastern edge of Stanytsia Luhanska, the SMM heard six undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 5-7km south-east. Later, while positioned about 250m south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge, the SMM heard an undetermined explosion at an assessed range of 2-3km north-east. All of the above ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

On the evening of 11 June, while in Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk), the SMM heard 60 explosions of artillery rounds (type undetermined) at an assessed distance of 5-8km east-south-east. On the same evening and night, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded an undetermined explosion, an illumination flare, and 21 projectiles in flight, all at an assessed range of 2-6km east-north-east and east. All of the ceasefire violations were assessed outside the **disengagement area near Zolote** but within 5km of its periphery.

On 12 June, on the southern edge of the disengagement area, the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them), two of whom walked inside the area along road T-1316 up to about 350m north of its southern edge and back.

On 11 June, just south of the northern edge of the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (nongovernment-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), within a former position of the armed formations, an SMM mini-UAV spotted a probable automatic grenade launcher.

On the evening of 11 June, inside the disengagement area, an SMM long-range UAV spotted two persons within a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces about 600m south of the area's northern edge and about 2.2km east of its western edge, as well as three persons within a former position of the armed formations near the area's south-eastern corner.

On the same evening, the SMM camera 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded two illumination flares at an assessed distance of 4-5km east-south-east. During the day on 12 June, while positioned at two locations near the disengagement area, the SMM heard 13 undetermined explosions and saw smoke rising from the area of one of the explosions. All of the ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the disengagement area near Petrivske but within 5km of its periphery.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons as part of the implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage areas, the SMM observed 31 weapons, 29 of which were in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone 7

The SMM observed 12 armoured combat vehicles and a trench digger in a government-controlled area of Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

Presence of mines near Verkhnoshyrokivske and unexploded ordnance on eastern edge of Lebedynske

At a checkpoint of the armed formations west of Verkhnoshyrokivske, the SMM <u>again</u> saw three anti-tank mines attached to a board and laid across a road leading towards Pyshchevyk (government-controlled, 84km south of Donetsk).

On the eastern edge of Lebedynske (government-controlled, 99km south of Donetsk), the SMM <u>again</u> saw a rusty artillery shell lying on an asphalted surface outside a compound.

SMM facilitation of repairs to and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to a localised ceasefire to enable vegetation clearance, inspection, and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned at three locations near the DFS, the SMM heard five undetermined explosions as well as bursts of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the Mission saw that the EECP near Marinka was open between 11:00 and 14:00 and that 13 people (mixed ages and genders) and about ten cars were queuing to travel toward non-government-controlled areas. While present, the SMM saw a civilian car and a white van with "DPR" plates and "funeral" written on the side pass through the checkpoint towards non-government-controlled areas (see below). SMM later saw the civilian car return after being denied passage to non-government-controlled areas.

The Mission saw that the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations east of Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk) remained closed. Throughout the day, the SMM saw a total of two civilians (a man and a woman in their forties) in two cars approaching the checkpoint and then departing after being denied passage toward government-controlled areas. While present, the SMM saw a white van with "DPR" plates and "funeral" written on the side, pass through the checkpoint towards non-government-controlled areas.

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska was open between 11:00 and 11:30, and that about 15 people (mixed genders and ages) were queueing at the EECP to travel toward non-government-controlled areas. While at the EECP, the SMM also saw four women and a man (all in their fifties) cross and arrive at the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge, where they were denied and subsequently returned to government-controlled areas.

The Mission noted that the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed.*

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Dnipro, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments — which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 10 June). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-
- At a checkpoint west of Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to quarantine restrictions due to COVID-19.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/unexploded ordnance (UXO):

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel on certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:

On the evening of 11 June, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas between

- government-controlled Novokalynove (29km north-west of Donetsk) and Taramchuk (29km south-west of Donetsk).⁸
- While conducting a mini-UAV flight over the southern part of Orlivske (government-controlled, 82km south of Donetsk), the SMM heard shots of small-arms fire assessed as directed at the UAV. Shortly thereafter, the UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming. The SMM safely landed the UAV and left the area (see above).


