
Daily Report 143/2020

17 June 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and more in Luhansk region.
- The SMM saw a recently destroyed house in Zaitseve, Donetsk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.*
- At night, the Mission spotted persons near former positions of the Ukrainian Armed Forces inside the disengagement area near Zolote and a person near a former position of the armed formations inside the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to critical civilian infrastructure and the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station.
- The SMM saw that the entry-exit checkpoint in Stanytsia Luhanska, the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations and the entry-exit checkpoint near Marinka were temporarily open.
- The Mission's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.*





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 80), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 205 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including the majority of explosions, were recorded in areas south-south-west and south-south-east of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk) and at southerly directions of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded more ceasefire violations, including, however, fewer explosions (about 50), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 70 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including almost all explosions, were recorded in areas north-east of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below).

Destroyed residential house in Zaitseve

On 13 June, in a residential area in south-western Zaitseve (50km north-east of Donetsk), about 250m east of the contact line, an SMM mid-range unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted a residential house previously used by the armed formations assessed as recently destroyed (not seen in imagery from 21 December 2019). The Mission could not assess the type of weapon used or direction of fire.

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line in Donetsk and Luhansk regions

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.⁵

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), members of the armed formations (eight of them visibly armed) again denied the SMM passage, once towards government-controlled areas, stating the need for "permission from superiors", and the second time towards non-government-controlled areas, without giving any reason.*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km northeast of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

Inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw three members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

On the evening of 15 June, inside the **disengagement area near Zolote**, an SMM long-range UAV spotted a person walking near a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces south of the railway line and about 1.2km east of the area's western edge. The UAV also spotted a person near a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces near the railway line, about 200m west of the area's north-eastern corner.

On the night of 15-16 June, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded four projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 4-6km east (assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery). On the same night, while on the northern edge of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk), the Mission heard eight undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 6-10km east (unable to be assessed as inside or outside the disengagement area).

On 16 June, while positioned near the southern edge of the disengagement area, the SMM heard 40 undetermined explosions and about 110 bursts of (30mm) cannon fire, all at an assessed range of 4-7km north-east (assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery).

On 16 June, the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near the southern edge of the disengagement area.

On the evening of 15 June, inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), an SMM long-range UAV spotted a person walking near a former position of the armed formations near the area's south-eastern corner.

On 15 June, outside the disengagement area near Petrivske, near the area's north-western edge, an SMM mini-UAV spotted four infantry fighting vehicles (three BMP-1 and one BMP-2) (for further details, see the table below).

On the same day, outside the disengagement area, close to the area's northern edge and about 600m east-north-east of its north-western edge, an SMM mini-UAV spotted two anti-tank mines (TM-62M), part of a larger minefield south of the road between Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) and Viktorivka (non-government-controlled, 42km south-west of Donetsk) assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces (for previous observations in the area, see SMM Daily Report 6 June 2020).

On 16 June, while positioned at two locations near the disengagement area, the Mission observed a calm situation.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum. It observed weapons beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, some of which were at railway stations (for further details, see the table below).

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone 7

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles on both sides of the contact line in Donetsk region and in government-controlled areas of Luhansk region, including within a residential area (for further details, see the table below).

Presence of anti-tank mines near Maiorsk and in Zaitseve

On 13 June, about 1.5km south-south-east of Maiorsk (government-controlled, 45km north-east of Donetsk), on a road leading towards Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk), an SMM mid-range UAV spotted for the first time three probable anti-tank mines, assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces.

On the same day, about 2km south-east of Maiorsk, in a field north-east of road T-0513 leading towards Horlivka, the same UAV again spotted at least 400 anti-tank mines. About 3km east of Maiorsk, the same UAV again spotted 16 anti-tank mines laid across a road leading towards Zaitseve. All of the mines were assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces (for previous observations in the area, see SMM Daily Report of 23 May 2020).

On the same day, the UAV <u>again</u> spotted six anti-tank mines assessed as belonging to the armed formations laid across Yesenina Street in the south-western part of Zaitseve, near an inhabited civilian house.

SMM facilitation of repairs to and maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure and a fund transfer

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable an assessment of power lines near Berezivske (non-government-controlled, 53km north-west of Luhansk), as well as vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The SMM also monitored adherence to a localised ceasefire to enable a transfer of funds from non-government- to government-controlled areas across the bridge in Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk), reportedly related to water payments.

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. While positioned at two locations near the station, the SMM heard an undetermined explosion as well as shots and bursts of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak and hardship of civilians

In Donetsk region, the SMM saw that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka remained closed.*

The Mission saw that the EECP near Marinka (government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) was temporarily open; it noted that the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations east of Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk) remained closed. During the day on 16 June, the SMM camera near Marinka saw two women crossing the EECP and walking towards the abovementioned checkpoint of the armed formations, from where they returned to the EECP.

At the Marinka EECP, an officer of the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine told the Mission that two people with a van had been waiting in the area between the EECP and the checkpoint of the armed formations near Oleksandrivka (non-government-conotrolled, 20km south-west of Donetsk) (located on the same crossing route as the abovementioned checkpoint east of Kreminets) for five days. Parked in front of that checkpoint, the SMM saw a green van. The Mission spoke with a man (in his fifties) who said that he had been waiting for five days to cross the checkpoint to travel towards non-government-controlled areas.

In Luhansk region, while at the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska, the Mission saw that it was temporarily open and that a total of about 110 people (mixed genders and ages) were queuing at the EECP to travel towards non-government-controlled areas and 45 were queuing to enter government-controlled areas.

The Mission noted that the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge was temporarily open. It saw 60 people (mixed genders and ages), including five people in wheelchairs, crossing the checkpoint towards non-government-controlled areas.

Throughout the day, the SMM camera north of the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge recorded 24 people (mixed genders and ages), four of whom were in wheelchairs, crossing the bridge towards government-controlled areas. The camera also recorded 130 people (mixed genders and ages), ten of whom were in wheelchairs, crossing the bridge towards non-government-controlled areas, one of whom returned to government-controlled areas.

According to a representative of the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine, 98 people were expected to enter and 51 people were expected to exit government-controlled areas on 16 June.

The abovementioned civilians reportedly crossed the contact line through the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska owing to special personal and humanitarian circumstances.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Dnipro, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for

Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 16 June). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), members of the armed formations (eight of them visibly armed) <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage, once towards government-controlled areas, stating the need for "permission from superiors", and the second time towards non-government-controlled areas, without giving any reason.
- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.

Delay:

- At a checkpoint near Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations allowed the SMM to proceed only after about 85 minutes of waiting.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:

- On the evening of 15 June, an SMM long-range UAV experienced signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near government-controlled Kostiantynivka (60km north of Donetsk) and Novotroitske (36km south-west of Donetsk).8


