# Daily Report 154/2020

30 June 2020<sup>1</sup>

### **Summary**

- Compared with the previous 24 hours, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.\*
- The Mission continued monitoring all three disengagement areas. It spotted a person on the eastern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote during evening hours.
- The SMM saw civilians travelling towards government- and non-government-controlled areas through the entry-exit checkpoint in Stanytsia Luhanska.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to and the maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure, as well as demining activities.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.\*



# Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including, however, more explosions (about 30), compared with the <u>previous 24 hours</u> (ten). The majority of ceasefire violations, including almost all explosions, were recorded at north-westerly directions of non-government-controlled Donetsk city and at north-easterly directions of Maiorsk (government-controlled, 45km north-east of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (20), compared with the <u>previous 24 hours</u> (about 30 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded at southerly directions of Trokhizbenka (government-controlled, 32km north-west of Luhansk).

# Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.<sup>5</sup>

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint.\*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the Mission passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to COVID-19.\*

#### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>6</sup>

During the day on 29 June, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw three members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

Also on 29 June, while positioned about 300m north of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge, the SMM heard 11 bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire at an assessed range of 5-7km south-west, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

On the evening of 27 June, an SMM long-range unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted a person inside a former position of the armed formations on the eastern edge of the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), about 1.5km north of its south-eastern corner.

During the day on 29 June, while positioned in Zolote-4/Rodina (government-controlled, 59km west of Luhansk), the SMM heard two undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 3-5km south-west, which were unable to be assessed as inside or outside the

disengagement area. On the same day, while positioned at two locations near the disengagement area, the SMM heard four undetermined explosions assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

Also on 29 June, the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) close to the southern edge of the disengagement area, two of whom were walking along road T-1316 inside the area up to about 350m north of its southern edge and back.

On 29 June, while positioned at two locations near the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), the SMM observed a calm situation.

### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

The Mission observed a weapon in violation of its withdrawal lines in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

# Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone<sup>7</sup>

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles in government- and non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, including in a zone within which deployment of heavy armament and military equipment is proscribed according to Point 5 of the Memorandum of 19 September 2014. It also observed an infantry fighting vehicle in a non-government-controlled area of Luhansk region (for further details, see the table below).

# SMM facilitation of repairs to and maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure, and of demining activities

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to power lines between non-government-controlled Zolote-5/Mykhailivka (58km west of Luhansk) and Pervomaisk (58km west of Luhansk), and between Raivka (16km north-west of Luhansk) and Zhovte (17km north-west of Luhansk), and to water infrastructure near non-government-controlled Pankivka (16km north of Luhansk) and Krasnyi Lyman (30km north-west of Luhansk), as well as to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk) and demining activities near Orikhove (government-controlled, 57km north-west of Luhansk).

While positioned near Krasnyi Lyman, the SMM heard 15 shots of small-arms fire nearby despite security guarantees having been provided for a localised ceasefire.

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned at a location near the DFS, the SMM heard six shots of small-arms fire assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

# Situation of civilians and measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM saw that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Hnutove (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk) and the checkpoint of the armed formations near Oleksandrivka were closed.\*

On 29 June, from 08:15 to 08:30 and from 14:00 to 14:30, the SMM saw that the EECP near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) was open but did not see any pedestrians or vehicles crossing through or near it.

While passing through the area between the forward positions of the Ukrainian Armed Forces near Berezove (government-controlled, 31km south-west of Donetsk) (north of Novotroitske) and those of the armed formations near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) from 08:30 to 08:35, the SMM did not see any pedestrians or vehicular traffic. From 08:30 to 09:30 on the same day, the SMM saw that the checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka was closed and that there were two members of the armed formations nearby. One of them told the SMM that the checkpoint was closed following a decision by those in control.

In Luhansk region, on 29 June, while at the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska at about 10:10 and 13:15, the Mission saw 41 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel towards government-controlled areas and 15 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel in the opposite direction, respectively. While near the EECP, the SMM observed two golf carts transporting people from a location south of the EECP to the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge and back.

While near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the bridge at 10:30, the SMM saw 31 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel towards non-government-controlled areas and no people queuing in the opposite direction. At 10:30, at the parking lot about 300m south of the bridge, the SMM saw two buses and 15 people (mixed genders and ages) queuing at a bus station, and from about 14:25 to 14:45, it saw 12 people (mixed genders and ages, including one child) queuing at the same bus station.

On 29 June, from 07:00 to 18:30, the SMM cameras at the parking lot south of the bridge recorded a total of about 596 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) walking towards government-controlled areas and about 424 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) walking towards non-government-controlled areas.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless,

the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see <u>SMM Daily Report 29 June 2020</u>). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint.
- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the Mission passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to COVID-19.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

#### Other impediments:

- On the evening of 27 June, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Zorynsk (non-government-controlled, 54km south-west of Luhansk).<sup>8</sup>
- On 29 June, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near government-controlled Chermalyk (77km south of Donetsk) and Lebedynske (99km south of Donetsk) respectively.
- On 29 June, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Pyshchevyk (government-controlled, 84km south of Donetsk).


