Summary


- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and fewer in Luhansk region.
- Small-arms fire was assessed as directed at an SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flying close to and over the areas close to the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The SMM followed up on reports of shelling in Horlivka, and its mini-UAVs spotted recent craters near Spartak and Zaitseve, Donetsk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.*
- The Mission continued monitoring all three disengagement areas: It observed people inside the disengagement area near Zolote during night hours and recorded ceasefire violations inside the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The SMM saw civilians queuing to travel towards government- and non-government-controlled areas at entry-exit checkpoints and checkpoints along the contact line. At a temporary checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka, the SMM observed long waiting hours and poor conditions for about 200 pedestrians queuing to travel towards government-controlled areas.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.*

Number of recorded explosions⁴





In Donetsk region, the Mission recorded more ceasefire violations, including, however, fewer explosions (seven), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 40 explosions). Almost all ceasefire violations, including all explosions, were recorded at south-easterly directions of Hnutove (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk) and at south-easterly directions of Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) (see below).

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations, all of which explosions (about 20), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (three explosions). All ceasefire violations were recorded in areas south-east of the disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk) and at northerly and south-westerly directions of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below).

Small-arms fire assessed as directed at SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle close to the disengagement area near Petrivske

While conducting a mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flight near and over the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM heard 30 shots of small-arms fire at a distance of about 400m east, assessed as aimed at the UAV, which was flying about 500m east, near the north-eastern edge of the disengagement area (see below) (for a similar incident in this area, see SMM Daily Report 16 June 2020). The SMM safely landed the UAV and left the area.*

SMM followed up on reports of shelling in Horlivka and spotted recent impacts in Spartak and Zaitseve, all in Donetsk region

On 5 July, on the north-eastern edge of Spartak (non-government-controlled, 9km north of Donetsk), an SMM mini-UAV spotted a hole assessed as a recent impact in the north-western-facing side of the roof of an industrial building (not seen in imagery from 10 April 2020), assessed as probably caused by a mortar round (the SMM was unable to assess the direction of fire).

On 6 July, on the south-western edge of Zaitseve (50km north-east of Donetsk), an SMM mini-UAV spotted a recent impact in the backyard of a residential property (about 70m north of a house), assessed as caused by a mortar round (probable 82mm) fired from a south-easterly direction.

On 7 July, the SMM followed up on reports of damage to civilian infrastructure in Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk) and conducted two mini-UAV flights in the area. The Mission will follow up with further assessments.

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.⁵

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to "a lack of permission from those in control".*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to restrictions due to COVID-19.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

On 6 July, outside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (about 600m north of the area), an SMM mini-UAV spotted a tractor digging a 20m-long extension of an existing trench system running east to west, assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces.

On the night of 6-7 July, while on the eastern edge of Stanytsia Luhanska, the SMM heard 16 undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 4-8km south-east, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

On 7 July, inside the disengagement area, the Mission saw two members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

On 5 July, inside the **disengagement area near Zolote**, an SMM mini-UAV spotted a person near a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces south of a railway track (about 500m west of the area's north-eastern corner) and another person near a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces near a railway track (about 1.2km east of the area's western edge).

On the evening of 6 July, inside the disengagement area near Zolote, an SMM long-range UAV spotted two people within a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces about 400m south of the area's northern edge and about 550m east of road T-1316, and again spotted a person within a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces south of the railway track and about 500m west of the area's north-eastern corner.

On the evening and night of 6-7 July, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded two undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 2-4km east. During the same time period, while on the northern edge of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk), the Mission heard four undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 5-10km south-east. All of the ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the disengagement area near Zolote but within 5km of its periphery.

On 7 July, the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) close to the southern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote. It saw four of them walking along road T-1316 inside the disengagement area up to about 350m north of its southern edge and then return.

On 5 July, outside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**, aerial imagery available to the SMM revealed the presence of improvements to a military position, assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces, about 1.2km south of the area's south-eastern corner. It also revealed improvements to a military-type position, assessed as belonging to the armed formations, about 900m east of the area's south-eastern corner (not seen in imagery from 23 June 2020).

On 7 July, while positioned east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM heard 35 shots of small-arms fire at an assessed range of 2-3km east, assessed as inside the disengagement area near Petrivske. While positioned on the north-western edge of Petrivske, the Mission heard 30 shots of small-arms fire at an assessed distance of 400m east (assessed as aimed at an SMM mini-UAV, see above), assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, the SMM observed a surface-to-air missile system in a residential area of government-controlled Donetsk region and two towed howitzers near a non-government-controlled area of Luhansk region (for further details, see the table below).

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone⁷

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions (for further details, see the table below).

Presence of anti-tank mines near Spartak

On 5 July, on the north-eastern edge of Spartak, an SMM mini-UAV spotted <u>again</u> 44 antitank mines laid in two rows across a road leading to Yasynuvata (non-government-controlled, 16km north-east of Donetsk), assessed as belonging to the armed formations. About 180m south of these mines, the UAV <u>again</u> spotted a roadblock consisting of concrete barriers across the full width of the road.

SMM facilitation of repairs to and maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure, and of demining activities

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to power lines between government-controlled Novozvanivka (70km west of Luhansk) and Troitske (69km west of Luhansk), near non-government-controlled Berezivske (53km north-west of Luhansk) and Raivka (16km north-west of Luhansk), and to water infrastructure near Pankivka (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk); inspection of and repairs to water infrastructure between government-controlled Novotoshkivske (53km west of Luhansk) and Nyzhnie (56km north-west of Luhansk); demining activities near government-controlled areas of Orikhove (57km north-west of Luhansk), Hirske (63km west of Luhansk) and Heivka (27km north-west of Luhansk); and

vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. While positioned at two locations near the station, the SMM heard three undetermined explosions as well as shots and bursts of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS.

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Luhansk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) in Stanytsia Luhanska was operational.

While at the EECP between 10:05 and 12:50, the Mission saw 125 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel towards government-controlled areas and 85 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel in the opposite direction. The Mission saw two golf carts transporting people from the EECP to the new section of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge and back.

In Donetsk region, the SMM saw that the EECP near Hnutove was operational but that there was no traffic in either direction. Between 10:45 and 15:00, at the EECP near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk), the Mission saw about 105 pedestrians and 12 vehicles traveling from non-government-towards government-controlled areas. A representative of the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine told the SMM that the pedestrians travelling from non-government-controlled areas were obliged to download a special application tracking self-isolation on their smart phones and that those who did not have it would be taken to a medical facility in Hostre (government-controlled, 30km west of Donetsk) for two weeks of mandatory quarantine.

Between 10:46 and 11:24 and again between 14:40 and 15:40, on the northern edge of Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-east of Donetsk), about 1km north of the checkpoint of the armed formations, the SMM saw a temporary checkpoint with three armed members of the armed formations inspecting vehicles. At this checkpoint, the Mission saw about 60 vehicles and about 200 pedestrians queuing to travel towards government-controlled areas. Two members of the armed formations told the SMM that only pedestrians registered in government-controlled areas were allowed to travel through the checkpoint in that direction. On two occasions, about 20 to 40 people, many of whom said they carried papers certifying their status as an internally displaced person, told the SMM of their intention to travel to government-controlled areas despite not having permanent registration in those areas. The Mission noted that there was no shade, sanitary facility or water for about 200 pedestrians, many of whom were elderly or young children, who were queuing for several hours under the sun. The SMM also saw an ambulance arrive at the checkpoint.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which

vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 29 June 2020). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to "a lack of permission from those in control".
- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to restrictions due to COVID-19.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:

- On the night of 6-7 July, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas between Nyzhnie (government-controlled, 56km north-west of Luhansk) and Krynychne (non-government-controlled, 45km west of Luhansk).⁸
- On 7 July, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk). While conducting a second mini-UAV flight over the disengagement area near Petrivske, the SMM heard shots of small-arms fire at an assessed distance of 400m east, assessed as aimed at the UAV. The SMM safely landed the UAV and left the area (see above).



When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.
