
Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM followed up on reports of a woman who died as a result of shrapnel injuries in Zhovanka, a government-controlled area of Zaitseve, Donetsk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the Mission passage at checkpoints along an official crossing route in Luhansk region.*
- The Mission continued monitoring all three disengagement areas: It observed people inside the disengagement areas near Zolote and Petrivske during night hours and recorded a ceasefire violation inside the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The SMM saw civilians queuing to travel towards government- and non-government-controlled areas at the entry-exit checkpoint in Stanytsia Luhanska.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted, including at a border crossing point near non-government-controlled Dovzhanske, Luhansk region.*

Number of recorded ceasefire violations³ Number of recorded explosions⁴



In Donetsk region, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including, however, more explosions (about 35 explosions), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (seven). Over half of all ceasefire violations and almost all of the explosions were recorded at southerly directions of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) and within a 5km radius of the station (see below).

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including no explosions, compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 20 explosions). All ceasefire violations were recorded in areas north and north-east of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below).

SMM followed up on reports of a civilian casualty in Donetsk region

The SMM followed up on reports of a woman (in her eighties) who died on 3 July as a result of shrapnel wounds in Zhovanka, a government-controlled area of Zaitseve (50km northeast of Donetsk).

On 4 July, a staff member at the central hospital in Bakhmut (formerly Artemivsk, government-controlled, 67km north of Donetsk) told the SMM that the body of a woman (in her eighties) had been brought to the morgue on the morning of 3 July.

On 8 July, the woman's daughter-in-law told the SMM that on the morning of 3 July, a neighbour had called to tell her that her mother-in-law had been injured in an explosion while near her home at 67 Manuilskoho Street in Zhovanka. The daughter-in-law said that by the time she had arrived at the house about an hour later, she had found that her mother-in-law had already died and that her body had been severely injured on the left side. She said she had seen blood in the yard and on the main road. She added that her mother-in-law had been taken to the morgue in Bakhmut and that following an autopsy, the coroner told her that she had died of blood loss as the result of shrapnel injuries.

On 6 July, to follow up on reports of shelling and the above civilian casualty, the SMM conducted a mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flight over 67 Manuilskoho Street on the south-western edge of Zaitseve, which revealed a recent impact in the backyard of a residential property (about 70m north of a house), assessed as caused by a mortar round (probable 82mm) fired from a southeasterly direction (for more information see SMM Daily Report 8 July 2020).

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.⁵

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to restrictions due to COVID-19.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

On 8 July, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk) the Mission saw two members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

On the night of 7-8 July, inside the **disengagement area near Zolote**, an SMM long-range UAV spotted three people within a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces south of a railway track (about 200m south of the area's northern edge and about 500m west of its eastern edge) and another person within a former position of the armed formations about 850m south of the area's north-eastern corner.

On the same night, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded a projectile in flight at an assessed range of 2-4km east, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery. On 8 July, while positioned on the southern edge of the disengagement area, the Mission recorded four bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire at an assessed range of 3-5km north-east. All of these ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

On 8 July, the Mission saw six members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) close to the southern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote. It saw two of them walking along road T-1316 inside the disengagement area up to about 350m north of its southern edge and then return.

On the night of 7-8 July, inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), an SMM long-range UAV spotted a person within a former position of the armed formations about 350m north of the area's south-eastern corner.

During the night of 7-8 July, the SMM camera located 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded an illumination flare at an assessed range of 3-5km east-south-east, which was unable to be assessed as inside or outside the disengagement area near Petrivske, and a burst at an assessed range of 2-4km east-south-east, assessed as inside the disengagement area.

On 8 July, while positioned near Bohdanivka, the SMM recorded four undetermined explosions assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, the SMM observed a surface-to-air missile system in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region. It also observed 23 weapons beyond

withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone 7

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

On 7 July, at two separate compounds near Memryk (government-controlled, 33km north-west of Donetsk), an SMM long-range UAV spotted an early warning radar (P-18 *Malakhit*) (active and turning) and a PRV-9 height finder radar.

SMM facilitation of repairs to and maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure, and of demining activities

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to power lines between government-controlled Novozvanivka (70km west of Luhansk) and Troitske (69km west of Luhansk), and near Berezivske (non-government-controlled, 53km north-west of Luhansk), as well as to water infrastructure near Pankivka (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk).

The SMM also facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable inspection of and repairs to water infrastructure between government-controlled Novotoshkivske (53km west of Luhansk) and Nyzhnie (56km north-west of Luhansk); demining activities near government-controlled Orikhove (57km north-west of Luhansk), Hirske (63km west of Luhansk) and Heivka (27km north-west of Luhansk); and vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The SMM facilitated localised ceasefires to enable the extinguishing of wildfires in the area of Smolianynove (government-controlled, 61km north-west of Luhansk).

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS, as well as repairs to a 600mm water pipeline near Kamianka (government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk). While positioned at two locations near DFS, the SMM heard five undetermined explosions, as well as shots and bursts of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS.

Mine action related activities near Kodema

On 7 July, in a field about 1.8km west of Kodema (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk), an SMM mini-UAV spotted marks on the ground indicating probable demining activities, as well as two people conducting probable demining activities.

Border areas outside of government control

While at the border crossing point at near Dovzhanske (84km south-east of Luhansk) for about 15 minutes, the SMM observed no cars or pedestrians crossing the border. The SMM observed about 25 vehicles (five with Ukrainian licence plates and 20 with "LPR" plates) as

well as a bus (about 50 passengers, mixed gender and ages) queuing to exit Ukraine. After seven minutes, a member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area.*

While at the pedestrian border crossing point near Novoborovytsi (79km south of Luhansk) for about 15 minutes, the SMM observed that it was closed and that there was neither any staff present nor cross-border traffic.

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Luhansk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) in Stanytsia Luhanska was operational. While at the EECP at about 09:50, 11:10, 13:40 and 14:10, the Mission saw 90 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel towards government-controlled areas and 75 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel in the opposite direction. The Mission saw two golf carts transporting people from the EECP to the new section of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge and back.

From 07:00 to 18:00, the SMM camera south of the Stanytsia Luhansk bridge recorded about 440 people traveling from government-controlled to non-government-controlled areas and about 350 traveling from non-government-controlled to government-controlled areas.

In Donetsk region, the SMM saw that the EECP near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and a checkpoint of the Ukrainian Armed Forces near Berezove (government-controlled, 31km south-west of Donetsk) were both operational but did not observe traffic in either direction at either location.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kviv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments — which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see below). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to restrictions due to COVID-19.

- At the border crossing point near Dovzhanske (non-government-controlled, 84km south-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:

- While following up on reports of a civilian casualty at a hospital in Makiivka (non-government-controlled, 12km north-east of Donetsk), a staff member told the SMM that information on the case of a boy fatally injured by an explosion in Makiivka could only be provided by those in control.
