
Daily Report 167/2020

 $\overline{15}$ July 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable the repairs and maintenance of critical civilian infrastructure.
- The Mission continued following up on the situation of civilians amid the COVID-19 outbreak, including at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (19), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (125 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded at southerly directions of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) and in areas east-south-east and southeast of Hnutove (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded fewer ceasefire violations (one), and no explosions, compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (18 explosions). The ceasefire violation was recorded in areas north-east of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk).

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁵

On 14 July, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw two members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) between the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk) and their checkpoint south of it.

On the evening of 13 July, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded an illumination flare at an assessed range of 4-6km east and assessed as outside the **disengagement area near Zolote** but within 5km of its periphery.

On 14 July, on the area's southern edge, the Mission saw six members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them), two of whom walked along road T-1316 inside the disengagement area up to about 350m north of its southern edge and then returned.

On 14 July, positioned about 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM observed a calm situation near the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk).

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone⁶

The SMM observed armoured personnel carriers in the security zone in government-controlled areas of both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (for further details, see the table below).

On the southern outskirts of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk), on road T-0504, the SMM saw for the first time a mobile checkpoint of the Ukrainian Armed Forces controlling traffic.

SMM facilitation of operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to water infrastructure near the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk); repairs of power and gas lines in Novozvanivka (government-controlled, 70km west of Luhansk) and Troitske (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk); repairs of a power line in Zolote-5/Mykhailivika (non-government-controlled, 61km north-west of Luhansk) and near Naberezhne (non-government-controlled, 77km south of Donetsk); as well as vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The SMM also monitored adherence to the ceasefire in order to enable a transfer of funds from non-government- to government-controlled areas of Luhansk region, reportedly related to water payments.

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. While positioned at three locations near the station, the Mission heard four undetermined explosions as well as bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station (see the table below).

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints to counter COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM saw that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and Marinka (government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) were both operational but that there was no traffic in either direction at either location. While at the checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) the Mission saw no traffic in either direction and assessed that it was not operational. While at a checkpoint of the armed formations near Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM saw that it was closed, and the Mission saw members of the armed formations conducting checks on a woman (in her sixties).

In Luhansk region, the SMM noted that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska was operational. While at the EECP, at 10:00 and 11:00, the Mission saw about 230 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel towards government-controlled areas and about 150 pedestrians (mixed genders and ages) queuing to travel in the opposite direction. The Mission also continued to see two golf carts operating between the EECP and the new section of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

From 06:30 to 18:00 on 14 July, the SMM camera south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge recorded about 720 people traveling to government-controlled from non-government-controlled areas and about 580 people traveling in the opposite direction.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 14 July 2020). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

⁸ The table only includes ceasefire violations directly observed by the SMM patrols or recorded by the SMM cameras and it may include those also assessed to be live-fire exercises, controlled detonations, etc. Details provided – in terms of distance, direction, weapons-type, etc. – are based on assessments provided by monitors on the ground and technical monitoring officers, and are not always necessarily precise. When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs, and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff has temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and patrols in this settlement during daylight hours, as well).
