


# Daily Report 250/2020

20 October 2020<sup>1</sup>

## Summary

- The SMM recorded 19 ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and none in Luhansk region. In the previous 24 hours, it recorded 18 ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and none in Luhansk region.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske.
- The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable repairs to and the operation of critical civilian infrastructure.
- The SMM continued following up on the situation of civilians amid the COVID-19 pandemic, including at an entry-exit checkpoint in Luhansk region.
- The Mission's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.\*



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 19 ceasefire violations (including ten undetermined explosions), the majority of which within a 5km radius of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) (see below). While positioned about 500m north-east of Kamianka (government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk), the Mission recorded three bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire, assessed as live-fire training by the Ukrainian Armed Forces in the security zone, in violation of the decision of the Trilateral Contact Group of 3 March 2016 that prohibits the conduct of live-fire training in the security zone. In the [previous 24 hours](#), the Mission recorded 18 ceasefire violations, all bursts of small-arms fire.

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded no ceasefire violations. In the [previous 24 hours](#), the Mission also recorded no ceasefire violations. The last time the SMM recorded a ceasefire violation in the region was on 15 October (see [SMM Daily Report 17 October 2020](#)).

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July until the end of the reporting period, the SMM has so far recorded a total of 1,735 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 464 explosions, 20 projectiles in flight, 15 muzzle flashes, 22 illumination flares and 1,214 bursts and shots).

### **Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>5</sup>**

On 19 October, while positioned in government-controlled areas of the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission observed a calm situation.

Near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with “JCCC” written on them).

While positioned near Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM observed a calm situation at the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk).

### **Withdrawal of weapons**

The Mission continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

The SMM observed 14 weapons in violation of withdrawal lines, all near a non-government-controlled training area near Novoselivka in Donetsk region (for further information, see the table below).

## **Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone<sup>6</sup>**

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions, including in residential areas, and in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk region (for further information, see the table below).

### **Anti-tank mines near the bridge in Shchastia**

On 18 October, about 2km east of Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) and about 150m south-east of the bridge there, an SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) [again](#) spotted 36 anti-tank mines laid in three rows across road H-21, assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces.

## **SMM facilitation of repairs to and operation of critical civilian infrastructure**

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable construction work south of the southern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote, north of Shchastia, and near Vesela Hora (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk), south of the bridge in Shchastia.

It also facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable railway inspection, maintenance and vegetation clearance near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk); repairs to water infrastructure near Pankivka (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk); maintenance of road T-1316 near Zolote and road H-21 south of Shchastia; and demining activities near Hirske (government-controlled, 63km west of Luhansk).

At the junction of roads H-21 and T-1309, the Mission saw about ten workers on the western side of road H-21, about 90m north-west of the checkpoint of the Ukrainian Armed forces, where processing booths for the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine (SBGS) are reportedly to be constructed.

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of DFS. While positioned in three locations near the DFS, it recorded eight undetermined explosions assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

## **Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints to counter the COVID-19 pandemic**

In Luhansk region, the Mission noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) in Stanytsia Luhanska was not operational. A representative of the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine told the SMM that the EECP would remain closed until 31 October because of COVID-19 mitigation measures, with special exceptions.<sup>7</sup>

On 18 October, from 09:30 to 11:00, the SMM observed that five people (four women and a man, mixed ages) had been allowed to exit government-controlled areas.

The SMM continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Dnipro, Kharkiv, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

### **\*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate**

*The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see [SMM Daily Report 12 October 2020](#)). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following [the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb](#); these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.*

#### Other impediments:

- On 19 October, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying between non-government- and government-controlled areas close to the disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk).<sup>8</sup>

#### *Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:*

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.



<sup>10</sup> The table only includes ceasefire violations directly observed by SMM patrols or recorded by the SMM cameras, and it may include those also assessed to be live-fire exercises, controlled detonations, etc. Details provided – in terms of distance, direction, weapons-type, etc. – are based on assessments provided by monitors on the ground and technical monitoring officers, and are not always necessarily precise. When information is not known (indicated with an “N/K”), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

(In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff have temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States, as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and also patrols in this settlement during daylight hours.)
