
# Daily Report 64/2021

19 March 2021<sup>1</sup>

#### **Summary**

- In Donetsk region, the Mission recorded 113 ceasefire violations. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 44 ceasefire violations in the region.
- In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded no ceasefire violations for the third consecutive day.
- The SMM lost spatial control of its mini-unmanned aerial vehicle near Verkhnotoretske, Donetsk region.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske. It recorded one burst of heavy-machine-gun fire inside the area near Petrivske.
- The Mission observed five weapons in violation of withdrawal lines in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region.
- The SMM saw anti-tank mines, some for the first time, near Lohvynove, Zaitseve and Pyshchevyk, Donetsk region.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure.
- The SMM continued following up on the situation of civilians, including at three entry-exit checkpoints and two corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations in Luhansk region.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.\*





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 113 ceasefire violations, including 35 undetermined explosions, most of which occurred during night time at southerly directions of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk). In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 44 ceasefire violations, some of which also occurred at southerly directions of Svitlodarsk.

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded no ceasefire violations for the third consecutive day. The last time the Mission recorded ceasefire violations in the region was on 15 March. (See SMM Daily Report of 16 March 2021.)

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July 2020 regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July 2020 until the end of the reporting period, the SMM has so far recorded at least 12,610 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 4,523 explosions, 1,500 projectiles in flight, 149 muzzle flashes, 63 illumination flares and at least 6,375 bursts and shots).

#### The SMM lost spatial control of its mini-unmanned aerial vehicle near Verkhnotoretske, Donetsk region

On 18 March, the SMM was positioned on the western edge of Verkhnotoretske (government-controlled, 23km north-east of Donetsk) to conduct an announced mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flight. At 11:55, while the UAV was flying about 2km east of the SMM's position, the aircraft experienced signal interference, immediately after which the SMM lost spatial control over it. At 12:20, the SMM was able to retrieve the UAV.\*

#### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>5</sup>

While positioned inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM observed a calm situation.

While positioned near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the **disengagement** area near **Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), the Mission again saw five containers inside a fenced perimeter south of its southern edge, on the southern edge of the road leading eastwards towards Zolote-5/Mykhailivka (non-government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk). The Mission also again saw another container on the area's southern edge.

Inside the area, it again saw a container about 60–70m north of the other five and another one about 350m north of the area's southern edge, both on the western edge of road T-1316.

While positioned near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the disengagement area, the Mission saw four members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them), two of whom walked inside the area to about 350m north of its southern edge and then returned.

While positioned about 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM heard one burst of heavy-machine-gun fire at an assessed range of 2-3km east-south-east, assessed as inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk).

While positioned about 2km north of Petrivske, the Mission observed an unarmed man (in his thirties) walking northwards towards Styla (non-government-controlled, 34km south of Donetsk) and a car driving southwards from the direction of Styla, carrying two men (in their fifties), and later, another car moving from Petrivske to Styla, carrying four men (in their fifties). All of these men were wearing military-style clothing.

#### Withdrawal of weapons

The Mission continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, the SMM observed five towed howitzers in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region. (For further information, see the table below.)

#### Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone<sup>6</sup>

The SMM saw armoured combat vehicles and anti-aircraft guns on both sides of the contact line in Donetsk region and in a non-government-controlled area of Luhansk region, including near residential houses. (For further information, see the table below.)

#### Anti-tank mines near Lohyynove, Zaitseve and Pyshchevyk, Donetsk region

On 15 March, about 3.3km north-west of Lohvynove (non-government-controlled, 59km north-east of Donetsk), an SMM mid-range UAV spotted for the first time at least 200 antitank mines laid in a field about 500m west of road E-40 (not visible in imagery from 4 August 2020).

On the same day, in three locations about 3km, 3.3km and 4km north-west of Lohvynove, the same UAV again spotted in total 60 anti-tank mines (including 22 TM-62) laid in three groups across the same road. About 2.2km north-west of Lohvynove, the UAV again spotted in total 113 anti-tank mines in fields on the eastern and western edges of the same road. (For previous observations in the area, see SMM Daily Reports of 28 July 2019, 20 January 2020, 7 August 2020 and 17 October 2020.)

All these mines were assessed as belonging to the armed formations.

On 16 March, in fields about 2km south of government-controlled areas of Zaitseve (50km north-east of Donetsk), an SMM mid-range UAV again spotted about 310 anti-tank mines, assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces. (For previous observations in the area see SMM Daily Reports of <u>9 April 2018</u> and of <u>27 October 2020.</u>)

On 17 March, about 1.7km east-south-east of Pyshchevyk (government-controlled, 84km south of Donetsk), an SMM mini-UAV again spotted about nine anti-tank mines, assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces, north of the road leading to Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk). (For previous observations in the area, see SMM Daily Reports of 13 May 2019 and of 11 February 2021.)

About 2km north-north-east of Sopyne (government-controlled, 101km south of Donetsk), the SMM observed ten de-miners (genders and ages unknown) of an international organization walking in fields east of a local road and carrying sticks (assessed as perimeter markers), as well as three vehicles parked nearby.

#### SMM facilitation of maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned at a location near Yasynuvata (non-government-controlled, 16km north-east of Donetsk), it recorded one undetermined explosion within a 5km radius of the station.

The SMM also monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable a regular railway track inspection, maintenance and vegetation clearance in Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk), as well as maintenance to power lines near non-government-controlled Zolote-5/Mykhailivka and Vesela Hora (16km north of Luhansk), in Novoluhanske (government-controlled, 53km north-east of Donetsk) and in a government-controlled area of Dolomitne (53km north-east of Donetsk). While positioned near Novoluhanske, the Mission heard two undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 5-7km south-east of its position.

#### Situation at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints

In Luhansk region, the Mission noted that the EECP near Stanytsia Luhanska was open, with people queueing to travel in both directions.

The SMM also noted that the EECPs near Zolote and Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) were open but did not observe any people passing through, and that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations south of the disengagement area near Zolote and 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia were closed.

While positioned at the EECP near Zolote, the SMM saw for the first time, on its northern edge, a blue tent as well as four cars, two mini-buses and one bus, all stationary south of the tent. Subsequently, the Mission observed the bus with one driver and one passenger (men in their forties) drive and stop at the northern edge of the disengagement area. An officer of the Ukrainian Armed Forces of the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) told the SMM that the bus was there to transport people intending to cross from government to non-government-controlled areas.

While positioned at the EECP near Shchastia, the Mission saw 24 members of the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine leaving the area in a bus. The SMM also saw six people (three women and three men, in their sixties) standing in the area of the checkpoint.

While positioned at the checkpoint of the armed formations 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia, the SMM observed the arrival and departure of four military-type trucks: three carrying between 12 and 20 members of the armed formations (some of them armed) respectively and one carrying food items. The Mission also saw eight members of the armed formations walking northwards toward the bridge carrying sleeping bags and backpacks.

The SMM continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Minsk agreements have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the JCCC should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the government. (For example, see SMM Daily Report of 16 March 2021.) The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

#### Other impediments:7

- An SMM mini-UAV experienced signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Verkhnotoretske (government-controlled, 23km north-east of Donetsk), immediately after which the Mission lost spatial control over it. The SMM was able to retrieve the UAV (see above). Another SMM mini-UAV experienced signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near the same settlement.



When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

The SMM is deployed to ten locations throughout Ukraine – Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Donetsk, Dnipro, Chernivtsi, Luhansk and Kyiv – as per Permanent Council Decision 1117 of 21 March 2014. This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff have temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States, as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and also patrols in this settlement during daylight hours).
