
# Daily Report 84/2021

13 April 2021<sup>1</sup>

### **Summary**

- In Donetsk region, the Mission recorded 40 ceasefire violations. In the previous 24 hours, it recorded 211 ceasefire violations in the region.
- In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded two ceasefire violations. In the previous 24 hours, it recorded 223 ceasefire violations in the region.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske.
- SMM unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) spotted weapons in violation of withdrawal lines in two training areas in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region; and beyond withdrawal lines in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region and in five training areas in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure and recorded ten ceasefire violations, including two explosions, close to the Donetsk Filtration Station.
- The Mission continued following up on the situation of civilians, including at four entry-exit checkpoints and the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted, including at a border crossing point near Izvaryne, Luhansk region and a checkpoint of the armed formations near Shevchenko, southern Donetsk region. Its UAVs again experienced multiple instances of GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming.\*





# Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 40 ceasefire violations, including 20 explosions (two assessed as impacts and 18 undetermined). The majority of ceasefire violations occurred at northerly and southerly directions of Zalizne (formerly Artemove, government-controlled, 42km north-east of Donetsk), at northerly and southerly directions of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk), and at northerly directions of Lebedynske (government-controlled, 99km south of Donetsk). In the <u>previous 24 hours</u>, the Mission recorded 211 ceasefire violations.

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded two ceasefire violations, both undetermined explosions, in an area east of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk). In the <u>previous 24 hours</u>, the Mission recorded 223 ceasefire violations.

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July 2020 regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July 2020 until the end of the reporting period, the SMM has so far recorded at least 18,093 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 6,122 explosions, 1,885 projectiles in flight, 182 muzzle flashes, 74 illumination flares and at least 9,830 bursts and shots).

# Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>5</sup>

On 12 April, while positioned inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw three members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) south of the repaired span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk).

While positioned near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the **disengagement** area near **Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them), two of whom walked inside the area to about 350m north of its southern edge and then returned.

Also, the Mission again saw the eight previously observed containers located south of the disengagement area's southern edge, on its edge and inside the area.

While positioned about 2km north of Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), the SMM recorded four shots of small-arms fire at an assessed range of 2-3km south-east, assessed as outside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** but within 5km of its periphery.

# Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, in two training areas in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region, the SMM saw 23 howitzers (11 self-propelled and 12 towed) and an antitank gun.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites, the Mission observed four surface-to-air missile systems (three of which probable) and two tanks in government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, as well as 99 tanks, 20 howitzers (eight self-propelled and 12 towed), six mortars (one self-propelled), four anti-tank guns and three surface-to-air missile systems in four training areas in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region and in a training area in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region. # Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone<sup>6</sup>

The SMM saw armoured combat vehicles, on both sides of the contact line in Donetsk region and in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region, including two in residential areas. (For further information, see the table below.)

# Anti-personnel mine near Molodizhne, Luhansk region

On 9 April, about 2.5km south-west of Molodizhne (non-government-controlled, 63km north-west of Luhansk) and about 10m north of road T-0504, an SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) again spotted an anti-personnel mine (probable MON-100), assessed as belonging to the armed formations. ### SMM facilitation of maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the DFS. While positioned at four locations near the station, the Mission heard ten ceasefire violations, including two explosions (one undetermined and the other assessed as an impact), assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS. The SMM also monitored the security situation near the pumping station near Vasylivka (non-government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk).

The Mission also monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable regular railway track inspection, maintenance and vegetation clearance in Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk) and maintenance of power lines in Opytne (government-controlled, 12km north-west of Donetsk).

# Situation at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints

In Donetsk region, the SMM noted that the EECP near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) were open, with traffic passing through in both directions.

In Luhansk region, the Mission noted that the EECP near Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of Stanytsia Luhanska bridge were open, with people queueing to travel in both directions. The SMM saw a woman (in her fifties) push a wheelchair with a woman (in her eighties) across the bridge from non-government-controlled areas. North of the bridge, both were picked up by a minivan bearing the logo of an international humanitarian organization, which then departed towards government-controlled areas.

The SMM also noted that the EECPs near Zolote and Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) were open, but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations south of the disengagement area near Zolote and 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia were closed.

### **Border areas outside government control**

While at a border crossing point near Izvaryne (52km south-east of Luhansk), the Mission observed two cars (with "LPR" plates) and a bus entering Ukraine, as well as 20 cars (including 13 with "LPR" plates) and 24 people (15 women and nine men, mixed ages) exiting Ukraine. After about five minutes, a member of the armed formations told the Mission to leave the area.\*

On the same day, while at a pedestrian border crossing point near Sievernyi (50km south-east of Luhansk) for about 20 minutes, the SMM observed four people (one woman and three men, mixed ages) entering Ukraine, as well as six people (three women and three men, mixed ages) exiting Ukraine.

The SMM continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Minsk agreements have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the government. (For example, see below.) The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denials:

- At a checkpoint near Shevchenko (non-government-controlled, 69km south of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations denied the Mission passage towards Prymorske (non-government-controlled, 76km south of Donetsk), citing "the safety of the SMM and an ongoing operation in the area".

- At a border crossing point near Izvaryne (non-government-controlled, 52km south-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area, referring to orders from superiors.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

# Other impediments:<sup>7</sup>

- On 12 April, an SMM mid-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Zaichenko (non-government-controlled, 93km south of Donetsk).
- On the same day, two SMM mini-UAVs experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk).
- On the same day, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Holubivka (formerly Kirovsk, non-government-controlled, 51km west of Luhansk).
- On the same day, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Krasnyi Lyman (non-government-controlled, 30km north-west of Luhansk).
- On the same day, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Smile (non-government-controlled, 31km north-west of Luhansk).
- On the same day, an SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Novohryhorivka (non-government-controlled, 33km west of Luhansk).
- On the same day, two SMM mini-UAVs experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Dovhe (non-government-controlled, 22km north-west of Luhansk).


