
Daily Report 145/2021

24 June 2021¹

Summary

- In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 179 ceasefire violations, including 115 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 77 ceasefire violations in the region.
- In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded 71 ceasefire violations, including 26 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 89 ceasefire violations in the region.
- The SMM continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske. It recorded ceasefire violations near the disengagement area near Zolote and inside and near the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable the operation and maintenance of critical civilian infrastructure.
- The SMM continued following up on the situation of civilians, including at four entry-exit checkpoints and the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The Mission's freedom of movement continued to be restricted. Its unmanned aerial vehicles again experienced instances of GPS signal interference.*





Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 179 ceasefire violations, including 115 undetermined explosions. The majority of ceasefire violations, occurred at south-easterly directions of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk), in an area north-west of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk) and south of the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) (see below). In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 77 ceasefire violations, some of which in areas near Svitlodarsk.

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded 71 ceasefire violations, including 26 undetermined explosions. The majority of ceasefire violations occurred at northerly, southerly and westerly directions of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk), including some at south-westerly directions of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) (see below). In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 89 ceasefire violations, some of which near the aforementioned disengagement area.

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July 2020 regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July 2020 until the end of the reporting period, the SMM has recorded at least 36,744 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 11,577 explosions, 6,158 projectiles in flight, 235 muzzle flashes, 122 illumination flares and at least 18,652 bursts and shots).

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁵

While positioned inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission saw four members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) south of the repaired span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk).

On the evening of 22 June, while on the northern edge of Popasna, the SMM heard three undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 5-7km east and south-east. During the day on 23 June, while positioned at three locations near the **disengagement area near Zolote**, the SMM heard nine undetermined explosions and 15 bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire. All these ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the disengagement area, but within 5km of its periphery.

While positioned near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the disengagement area, the Mission saw four members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them). The SMM again saw the seven previously observed containers located south of the disengagement area's southern edge and inside the area.

On the evening of 22June, the SMM camera 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded seven projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 2-3km south-east, assessed as inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**.

During the day on 23 June, while positioned at two locations near the area, the Mission heard nine undetermined explosions, 30 bursts and shots of small-arms and heavy-machine-gun fire, all assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, the Mission saw a surface-to-air missile system near a residential area in a government-controlled area of Donetsk region and two howitzers in a non-government-controlled area of Donetsk region.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage areas, in government-controlled areas, the SMM saw four surface-to-air missile systems in a compound near a residential area of in Donetsk region and two other surface-to-air missile systems at a railway station in Luhansk region. Indication of military and military-type presence in the security zone

The SMM saw four armoured combat vehicles and an anti-aircraft gun in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions, including at a compound and in and near residential areas. (For further information, see the table below.)

Presence of anti-tank mines near Yasne, Donetsk region

On 22 June, in a field about 800m north of Yasne (non-government-controlled, 30km southwest of Donetsk), an SMM mini unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted for the first time at least 60 anti-tank mines (TM-62), assessed as not recently laid, belonging to the armed formations.

On 23 June, in a field on the northern edge of Novoluhanske (government-controlled, 53km north-east of Donetsk), the SMM observed eight members (genders and ages unknown) of an international organization using mine detectors. (For previous observations in the area, please see the SMM Daily Report of 23 June 2021.)

SMM facilitation of maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned on the eastern edge of Avdiivka (government-controlled, 17km north of Donetsk), the SMM heard one undetermined explosion, assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS.

The SMM also monitored the security situation around the pumping station near Vasylivka (non-government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk), and adherence to a localized ceasefire to enable maintenance of a power line in Pryshyb (non-government-controlled, 34km northwest of Luhansk).

Situation at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints

In Donetsk region, the Mission noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Maiorsk (government-controlled, 45km north-east of Donetsk) was open, but did not observe any traffic

passing through; and that the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk) was closed.

At the EECP near Maiorsk, the SMM observed a hole in the lower part of the south-east-facing side of a metal container which serves as documents processing booth, about 10m north of road T-0516. The Mission assessed the hole as recent and caused by small-arms fire.

In Luhansk region, the Mission observed that the EECP near Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of Stanytsia Luhanska bridge were open, with people queueing to travel in both directions.

The SMM also noted that the EECPs near Zolote and Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) were open, but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations south of the disengagement area near Zolote and 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia were closed.

Border areas outside government control

The Mission monitored border areas outside government control along the border with the Russian Federation near Novooleksandrivka (75km south-east of Donetsk), Zelenyi Hai (73km south-east of Donetsk) and Shevchenko (65km south-east of Donetsk) and observed no change in the security situation.

The SMM continued monitoring in Kherson, Lviv, Odessa, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Minsk agreements have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the government (for example, see the SMM Daily Report of 22 June 2021). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:6

- Two SMM mini-UAVs experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, during two flights over areas near Betmanove (formerly Krasnyi Partyzan, non-government-controlled, 23km north-east of Donetsk).
- The Mission was also unable to launch one mid-range UAV near Betmanove due to GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming.



When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff have temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States, as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and also patrols in this settlement during daylight hours).
