
# Daily Report 152/2021

2 July 2021<sup>1</sup>

### **Summary**

- In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 927 ceasefire violations, including 40 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 78 ceasefire violations in the region.
- In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded 111 ceasefire violations, including 17 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 84 ceasefire violations in the region.
- The SMM followed up on reports of a man injured due to small-arms fire near Avdiivka, Donetsk region, and three men injured due to the detonation of explosive objects near Slovianoserbsk, Luhansk region.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske.
- The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable the operation of critical civilian infrastructure.
- The Mission continued following up on the situation of civilians, including at four entryexit checkpoints and four corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM monitored border areas outside government control in Donetsk region and observed no change in the security situation.
- The Mission's freedom of movement continued to be restricted, including at a checkpoint
  of the armed formations in southern Donetsk region. Its UAVs again experienced instances
  of GPS signal interference.





### Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 927 ceasefire violations, including 40 explosions (one impact and 39 undetermined). The majority of ceasefire violations occurred in areas north-west of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk). In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 78 ceasefire violations, some of which were recorded in areas west of Horlivka.

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded 111 ceasefire violations, including 17 explosions (12 outgoing tank rounds and five undetermined). The majority of ceasefire violations occurred in an area south of Buhaivka (non-government-controlled, 37km south-west of Luhansk) and were assessed as a live-fire exercise outside the security zone. In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 84 ceasefire violations.

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July 2020 regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July 2020 until the end of the reporting period, the SMM has recorded at least 40,719 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 12,256 explosions, 6,401 projectiles in flight, 237 muzzle flashes, 127 illumination flares and at least 21,698 bursts and shots).

A man injured due to small-arms fire near government-controlled Avdiivka, Donetsk region, and three men injured due to the detonation of explosive objects near non-government-controlled Slovianoserbsk, Luhansk region

The SMM followed up on reports of a man injured on 19 June 2021 in Avdiivka (government-controlled, 17km north of Donetsk).

On 21 June, a man (in his thirties) told the Mission over the phone that on 19 June he had been in his garden at 111 Kolosova Street in the east-south-eastern part of Avdiivka when he had felt an undetermined object hit his head from behind, after which he had fallen to the ground and had seen a bullet on the ground next to him. He said that a neighbour (man, age unknown) had then called an ambulance, which had brought him to a hospital in Avdiivka. On 26 June, at the home of the injured man at the aforementioned address, the SMM observed a bandage on the man's head.

On 30 June, medical staff at a hospital in Avdiivka told the Mission that on 19 June, a man (in his thirties) had been admitted to the hospital with a wound to his head consistent with a gunshot injury.

The SMM also followed up on reports of three men (two of them in their fifties and one in his sixties) injured on 22 May 2021 near non-government-controlled Slovianoserbsk (non-government-controlled, 28km north-west of Luhansk), while fishing by the Siverskyi Donets River.

On 25 June, a man (in his sixties) told the SMM that on 22 May he had been fishing with two friends (in their fifties) by the Siverskyi Donets River, when one of them had stepped on an object that had exploded. He said that while he had run to call for help, he had heard a second explosion, when his second friend stepped on another object. He added that, as he had gone back to collect his belongings, he had stepped on an object that had exploded, injuring his both his legs, one of which, his left leg, had to be amputated.

On 30 June, a man (in his fifties) told the Mission over the phone that one 22 May he had gone fishing by the Siverskyi Donets River with two other men (in their fifties and sixties) and that he had stepped on an object that had exploded. He told the SMM that his right leg had to be amputated and he sustained explosive shrapnel injuries in his left leg.

On the same day, a woman (age unknown). who introduced herself as the wife of one of the injured men (in his fifties) told the Mission over the phone that on 22 May her husband had gone fishing near Slovianoserbsk and that he had sustained injuries to both legs due to the detonation of an explosive object and that his right leg had to be amputated.

On 24 May, medical staff at a hospital in Luhansk city (non-government-controlled) told the SMM that three men (two of them in their fifties and one in his sixties) had been admitted to the hospital on 22 May and that all three of them had lost limbs and had suffered multiple wounds consistent with injuries caused by a mine explosion, but refused to provide additional information, referring the SMM to those in control.\*

### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>5</sup>

While positioned inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission saw three members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) south of the repaired span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk).

While positioned on the southern edge of Berezivske (non-government-controlled, 53km west of Luhansk), the Mission heard two shots of small-arms fire at an assessed distance of 1km north-west. While positioned about 3km north of Pervomaisk (non-government-controlled, 58km west of Luhansk), the SMM heard three undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 3-5km north-east. All these ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) but within 5km of its periphery.

On 1 July, while positioned near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the area, the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them). The SMM again saw the seven previously observed containers located south of the disengagement area's southern edge and inside the area.

On the night of 30 June - 1 July, the SMM camera about 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded 15 projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 2-4km south-east, unable to be assessed as inside or outside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk).

On 1 July, while positioned at three locations near the area, the SMM observed a calm situation.

### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, the SMM saw a probable anti-tank guided missile in a government-controlled area, and seven howitzers and a multiple launch rocket system in non-government-controlled areas, all in Donetsk region.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage areas, the Mission saw 26 weapons in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions, including in a compound and at a railway station, and 82 weapons in three training areas in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk region. (For further information, see the tables below.)

### Indication of military and military-type presence in the security zone

The SMM saw ten armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions, including in and near residential areas. (For further information, see the table below.)

While positioned about 800m north of Zaichenko (non-government-controlled, 93km south of Donetsk), the Mission observed a non-SMM unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flying at an altitude of about 90m, about 100m south of the Mission's position, despite the ban on the operation of any aerial vehicles included in the 22 July 2020 Trilateral Contact Group decision regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire.

### Presence of mines near Starohnativka, Bila Kamianka and Pikuzy, Donetsk region

On 26 June, about 4km east of Starohnativka (government-controlled, 51km south of Donetsk), an SMM mini-UAV spotted for the first time five anti-tank mines laid across a road leading to Bila Kamianka (non-government-controlled, 51km south of Donetsk). About 2km further east, the UAV spotted for the first time eight anti-tank mines laid across the same road. All these mines were assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces and unable to be assessed if recently laid. (For previous observations in the area, see SMM Daily Report 9 March 2020.)

At three locations about 40-160m further east on the same road, the same UAV again spotted three anti-tank mines (one of them probable): two laid on the road, and one on the southern edge of the road. All these mines were assessed as belonging to the armed formations. (For previous observations in the areas, see SMM Daily Reports of 17 September 2019 and 5 August 2020.)

On 30 June, about 20m north-west of a residential house on the north-western edge of Pikuzy (formerly Kominternove, non-government-controlled, 92km south of Donetsk), an SMM midrange UAV spotted for the first time 15 anti-tank mines laid across a road leading to Talakivka (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk) (not visible in imagery from 10 January 2020). About 450m south-south-west, in a residential area of Pikuzy, the same UAV spotted for the first time 18 anti-tank mines laid across road T-0519 (not visible in imagery from 19 April 2021). All these mines were assessed as belonging to the armed formations.

### SMM facilitation of maintenance and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (15km north of Donetsk) and monitored the security situation near the pumping station near Vasylivka (nongovernment-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk).

### Situation at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints

In Donetsk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Marinka was open while the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk) was closed.

In Luhansk region, the Mission observed that the EECP near Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of Stanytsia Luhanska bridge were open, with people queueing to travel in both directions.

The SMM also noted that the EECPs near Zolote and Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) were open, but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations south of the disengagement area near Zolote and 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia were closed. At the latter EECP, the Mission observed a car and two trucks bearing the logo of an international humanitarian organization travelling towards government-controlled areas. About 150m east of the checkpoint 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia, the SMM observed a construction assessed as a weighbridge.

### **Border areas outside government control**

While at a border crossing point<sup>6</sup> near Novoazovsk (102km south-east of Donetsk) for about 1.5 hour, the SMM observed seven cars (including five with "DPR" plates) entering Ukraine and 30 cars (including 18 with "DPR" plates), two trucks (with "DPR" plates, one with covered cargo and one carrying gravel) and three mini-buses (including one with "DPR" plates, with passengers of mixed genders and ages) exiting Ukraine.

The SMM also monitored areas close to the border with the Russian Federation in Donetsk region near Klynkyne (85km south-east of Donetsk) and observed no change in the security situation.

The SMM continued monitoring in Kherson, Lviv, Odessa, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Minsk agreements have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the government (for example, see SMM Daily Report of 30 June

<u>2021</u>). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following <u>the fatal</u> <u>incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb</u>; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denials:

On 1 July, at a checkpoint of the armed formations north of Zaichenko (non-government-controlled, 93km south of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations denied the SMM passage westwards towards Pikuzy (formerly Kominternove, non-government-controlled, 92km south of Donetsk) and southwards towards Sakhanka (non-government-controlled, 97km south of Donetsk), citing "the SMM's safety" and "demining and engineering activities in the area". While at the checkpoint, the Mission observed civilian traffic passing through in both directions, and it observed a non-SMM UAV flying near the checkpoint. (See above and below.)

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

 The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

### Other impediments<sup>7</sup>:

- On 24 May, medical staff at a hospital in Luhansk city refused to provide the SMM with additional information regarding three civilian casualties and told the Mission to address those in control with a written request. (See above.)
- On 1 July, an SMM mid-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Sosnivske (non-government-controlled, 78km south of Donetsk).
- On the same day, the SMM was unable to launch three SMM mid-range UAV flights due to GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, in areas near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), Styla (non-government-controlled, 34km south of Donetsk) and Kurdiumivka (government-controlled, 54km north of Donetsk).
- Also on the same day, ten SMM mini-UAVs experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, during one flight over areas near Olenivka, Sarabash (formerly Komunarivka, non-government-controlled, 26km south of Donetsk), Styla, Kodema (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk), Kurdiumivka, Bila Hora (government-controlled, 54km north of Donetsk), Klishchiivka (government-controlled, 60km north of Donetsk), Pavlopil (government-controlled, 84km south of Donetsk), Stepnyi Yar (government-controlled, 57km north-west of Luhansk) and Kalynove-Borshchuvate (non-government-controlled, 61km west of Luhansk); and during two flights over areas near Yasne (non-government-controlled, 30km south-west of Donetsk) and areas near Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk).


