


OSCCE Special Monitoring Mission to Ukraine

Daily Report 231/2021

2 October 2021¹

Summary

- In Donetsk region, the Mission recorded 209 ceasefire violations, including 13 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 250 ceasefire violations in the region.
- In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded 21 ceasefire violations, including 16 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 28 ceasefire violations in the region.
- An SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) was assessed as targeted by small-arms fire near the disengagement area near Petrivske, Donetsk region.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske, and recorded ceasefire violations inside the area near Petrivske.
- The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable the operation and repairs of critical civilian infrastructure.
- The Mission continued following up on the situation of civilians, including at four entry-exit checkpoints and the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The Mission's freedom of movement continued to be restricted, including at a checkpoint near non-government-controlled Horlivka, Donetsk region. Its UAVs again experienced multiple instances of jamming.*





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 209 ceasefire violations, including 13 undetermined explosions. The majority of ceasefire violations occurred at southerly directions of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk) and in areas north of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk). In the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded 250 ceasefire violations, most of which also occurred near Svitlodarsk and Shyrokyne.

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded 21 ceasefire violations, including 16 undetermined explosions. The majority of ceasefire violations occurred in areas south-east of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk). In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the SMM recorded 47 ceasefire violations.

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July 2020 regarding Measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July 2020 until the end of the reporting period, the Mission has recorded at least 61,679 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 17,065 explosions, 12,163 projectiles in flight, 272 muzzle flashes, 246 illumination flares and at least 31,933 bursts and shots).

Small-arms fire assessed as directed at an SMM mini-UAV near Bohdanivka, Donetsk region

While positioned about 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) to conduct an announced mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) flight near the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), the SMM heard eight shots and bursts of small-arms fire at an assessed distance of 600m east of the SMM's position, assessed as targeting the UAV, which was flying near the positions of the Ukrainian Armed Forces. During the same flight, the UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming. The Mission landed the UAV and left the area.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁵

Inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission saw three members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) south of the repaired span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk).

Near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them). The SMM again saw the seven previously observed containers located south of the disengagement area's southern edge and inside the area, as well as the previously reported underground structure inside the area.

On the night of 30 September-1 October, the SMM camera 2km east of Bohdanivka recorded seven projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 1-3km east-south-east and south-east, assessed as inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**.

During the day on 1 October, while positioned about 2km east of Bohdanivka, the SMM heard eight shots and bursts of small-arms fire, unable to be assessed as inside or outside the disengagement area (see above).

On the same day, while positioned at the same and another location near the disengagement area, the Mission heard two undetermined explosions, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

Withdrawal of weapons⁶

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, the Mission observed 24 howitzers, six anti-tank guns, and two multiple launch rocket systems in a training area near Buhaivka (non-government-controlled, 37km south-west of Luhansk).

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites, the SMM observed six mortars in a government-controlled area of Donetsk region. It also saw 15 tanks, five surface-to-air missile systems, and three mortars in the abovementioned training area, as well as a tank in a compound near a residential area in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region. Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone

The Mission observed five infantry fighting vehicles near a residential area in a governmentcontrolled area of Donetsk region. (For further information, see the table below.)

De-mining near government-controlled Sopyne, Donetsk region

About 650m north-west of Sopyne (government-controlled, 101km south of Donetsk), the Mission observed five men in uniforms of a humanitarian organization conducting de-mining in a field about 50m east of road C-051244.

SMM facilitation - the operation and repair of critical civilian infrastructure

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned about 2km south-south-east of Kamianka (government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk), the SMM heard an undetermined explosion and seven bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the DFS.

The SMM also monitored the security situation around the pumping station near Vasylivka (non-government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk).

The Mission also monitored adherence to a localized ceasefire to enable assessment and maintenance at the phenol sludge reservoir near Nelipivka (government-controlled, 40km north of Donetsk).

Situation at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints

In Donetsk region, the SMM observed that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations near Olenivka (non-government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk) were open, with people queueing to travel in both directions.

In Luhansk region, the Mission observed that the EECP near Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge were open, with people queueing to travel in both directions. South of the EECP, the SMM saw a newly-installed fence at the centre of the road leading southwards to the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge. About 300m south of the EECP on the same road, the Mission saw newly-installed metallic foundations, reportedly to be used for a shelter for people traveling towards government-controlled areas. (For previous observations in the area, see <u>SMM Daily Report of 1 October 2021</u>.)

The Mission noted that the EECPs near Zolote and Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) were open, but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations south of the disengagement area near Zolote and 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia were closed.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro, Chernivtsi, and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, UXO and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Minsk agreements have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the government (for example, see <u>SMM Daily Report of 28 September 2021</u>). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following <u>the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb</u>; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial:

- At a checkpoint on the southern edge of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km northeast of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations denied the SMM passage south-west towards Ozerianivka (non-government-controlled, 35km north-east of Donetsk), citing "orders from his superiors". While at the checkpoint, the Mission saw civilian traffic passing through.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:⁷

- While conducting a mini-UAV flight near Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41 southwest of Donetsk), near the disengagement area near Petrivske, the Mission heard eight shots and bursts of small-arms fire, assessed as targeting the UAV. During the same flight, the mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming. (See above.)
- While conducting an operational test flight, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near government-controlled Varvarivka (81km north-west of Donetsk) and Novoandriivka (75km north-west of Donetsk), as well as dual GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by jamming, while flying over areas near government-controlled Novohryhorivka (70km north-west of Donetsk) and Stepanivka (54km north of Donetsk).
- SMM mini-UAVs experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, during 20 flights: on four occasions each near non-government-controlled Holmivskyi (49km north-east of Donetsk) and Shyroka Balka (34km north-east of Donetsk), on three occasions near Hrechyshkyne (government-controlled, 45km north-west of Luhansk), on two occasions each near Vesele (government-controlled, 21km north of Donetsk) and Sukhodil (non-government-controlled, 21km west of Luhansk), and once near Ozerianivka (non-government-controlled, 35km north-east of Donetsk), Krasnohorivka (government-controlled, 24km north of Donetsk), Kruta Hora (non-government-controlled, 16km west of Luhansk), and Smile (non-government-controlled, 31km north-west of Luhansk).



When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff have temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States, as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and also patrols in this settlement during daylight hours).
