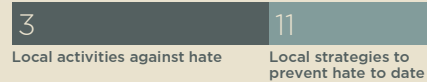

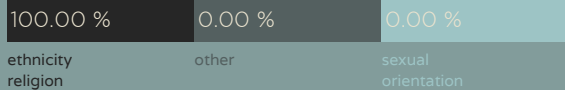

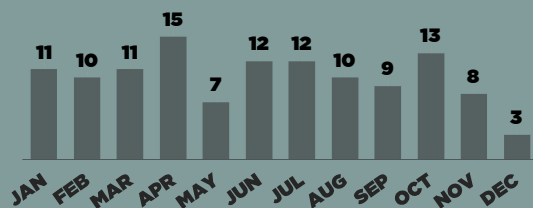

On 11 December, 24 Coalitions against Hate (CaH) representatives gathered in Mostar at their annual country-wide meeting to discuss activities on developing Community Cohesion Action Plans and their role in contributing to social cohesion at a local level.
