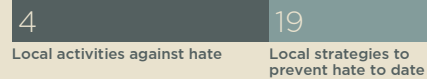

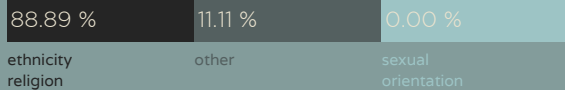

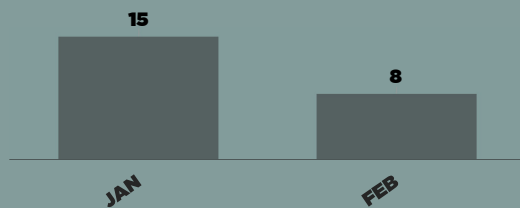

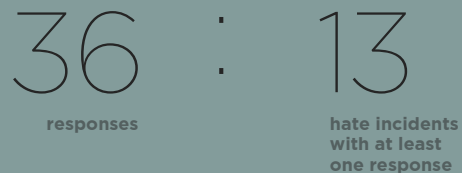

On 22 February, the NGO Kvart of Prijedor publicly condemned the promotion of a movie screening organized by the United Srpska Party about Draža Mihailović, WWII war criminal, as the promotion denies war crimes and incites ethnic hatred, intimidating members of minority ethnic groups in Prijedor.
