TYPES OF INCIDENTS




Incidents can consist of several acts.





On 27 January, Coalition against Hate from Tuzla publicly condemned the desecration of Veresike, a Catholic graveyard near Tuzla, stating that such actions are highly offensive to all citizens who are committed to coexistence and mutual respect. The Coalition has called on the relevant institutions to find and sanction the perpetrators.
