Mister President,

I represent the international raelian mouvement >French speaking countries keep on calling secte despite ONU recommandations

The CIAOSN and Milvudes, French and Belgium organizations that are responsible for protection against "sects" and now against "sectarian derive", ,continue to influence the Judicial system and government officials with massive communications on the subject of "sectarian derive" where the words' sect 'and'sectarian derive' are widely cited, creating, fear and discrimination.

In one of their brochures titled "le guide de l'agent public - Guide for Public Agents" we are nominated on page 86 as a "sectarian organization". For the French Government, we are a criminal organization that pretends to follow a religious goal. We would like to know on which legal foundation do they base their accusations, and as we know that there aren't any, we therefore accuse France of spreading hate and violence towards members of our religion.

We recommend the following:

1. An end to public contributions from the French State to 'anti-sect movements';
2. The immediate dissolution of Miviludes and CIAOSN
3. The suppression of the anti-sect legislation in particular the law about picard
4. The immediate end of specific training for government officials (judges, policemen, teachers, educators etc.) targeted at fighting these so called "sects";

5. A vote for new laws, that would recognize the same benefits that are accorded to Jews and Muslims for members of religious minorities;
6. A modification of the Halde in France and the Centre of Equal Opportunities in Belgium in order to make them also promote tolerance and respect towards members of religious minorities;
7. The official destruction of the French and Belgium parliamentary reports that have established a list of "sects" and an official apology from the parliaments;
8. Legal action against the discriminatory use of the list of sects, because even if this list has no legal basis, it still represents moral and social discrimination;

We do not in any way request to reduce efforts to combat legally reprehensible actions, but we urge to do so without discrimination, for both legal cults and non-recognized religious minorities.

We hope the OSCE and each country here present will apply pressure towards these two countries to change their policies that quite clearly resemble fascist treatment of religious minorities.
