







Capacity Building Basis for Regional Co-operation

National Oil Spill Contingency Planning

- Based on Adopted National Legislation
- In compliance with:
 - >> OPI Protocol to the Tehran Convention.
 - International OPRC Convention.
 - International agreed Guidelines on Contingency Planning.
 - >> Adjusted to national requirements and needs.

Capacity Building Regional Co-operation

- Agreement by Tehran Convention COP may establish a Regional Centre under OPI Protocol as follows:
 - Subsidiary Body to Tehran Convention COP
 - Independent status in relation to Host Country (diplomatic immunity?)
 - Executive Officer and Staffing from Member States
 - Terms of Reference to be adopted by COP
 - Host Country to provide office facilities and utilities
 - Operational costs to be shared by Member States

Regional Centre

- Main tasks:
 - Assistance to national contingency planning
 - Planning and Coordination, Meetings of National Oil Spill Response Experts
 - ▶ Maintenance of Regional Plan on Cooperation
 - Development of Action Plan for prevention of oil spills
 - Coordination of training
 - Dissemination of information
 - Close relationship with IPIECA / OSPRI (i.e. oil industry)

Examples of Active Regional Centres

- The Baltic Sea: HELCOM Secretariat in Helsinki
- The Black Sea: ERAC in Varna
- The Persian Gulf: MEMAC in Bahrain
- The Mediterranean Sea: REMPEC on Malta
- North West Pacific Region: MERAC in R. o. Korea
- The North Sea and English Chanel: Bonn Agreement Secretariat in London

Conclusions

- Increasing oil industry activity
- Sensitive region requiring protection
- Capacity building to be based on Regional agreement and individual country response capacity.
- Agreement to establish a Regional Centre to facilitate Capacity Building
- Terms of Reference and location for the Regional Oil Spill Response Centre to be adopted by Tehran Convention COP.
