The Helsinki Document of 1992 (Chapter IV) called for increasing the openness of OSCE activities and expanding the role of NGOs. In particular, in paragraph (15) of Chapter IV the participating States decided to facilitate during CSCE meetings informal discussion meetings between representatives of participating States and of NGOs, and to provide encouragement to NGOs organizing meetings on CSCE-related issues. In line with this decision, governments, civil society and other participants are encouraged to organize side meetings on relevant issues of their choice.

Title: Victim-Centered, Systematic and Integrated Approach on Preventing the

Trafficking of Children

Summary: This side event will discuss current trends needs and vulnerabilities of children in the Balkan and Mediterranean region as observed by front line professionals and NGOs. We will discuss appropriate prevention methods for countries of origin as well as destination of victims of human trafficking. The focus will be at systemic and integrated approaches in prevention. We will analyse good practice initiatives and partnerships between NGO and Public Sector.

The side event will conclude with an interactive workshop where the participants will collaborate in order to develop a strategy and messaging addressing specific root causes of vulnerability among unaccompanied children in the region today.

Summary: Children are targeted by traffickers because they are easily manipulated and because commercial sex buyers are willing to pay more for youth. Rescue is often just the beginning of the long road of healing, which may wind back through periods of exploitation and abuse. Early identification, trafficking-specific psychological intervention, and emotionally supportive long-term care are critical for helping children reclaim their identity and dreams—permanently leaving a life of exploitation.

Title: Trafficking along migration routes to Europe: Bridging the Gap between

Migration, Asylum and Anti-Trafficking

Summary: The years 2015-2016 saw an unprecedented increase in the numbers of people travelling by sea and overland along the migration routes to the European Union, with a total of almost one and a half million people irregularly entering EU countries. Trafficking and exploitation are a major cause for concern among migrants on the move to Europe but the number of victims who are actually formally identified remains extremely low, as shown by a recent study conducted by the International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD) along the Western Balkans route.

The aim of this side event is to present the main research results of the study *Trafficking along migration routes to Europe: Bridging the Gap between Migration, Asylum and Anti-Trafficking,* with a special focus on unaccompanied and separated children travelling to Europe along the Western Balkans route.
