## EU Statement on Abduction and Illegal Detention of Ukrainian Citizens by the Russian Federation

The latest reports on Nadiya Savchenko's deteriorating health and her hunger and thirst strike are extremely concerning. We call on Russia to arrange her immediate release.

The European Union recalls that all hostages and illegally detained persons related to the crisis in and around Ukraine should be released as stipulated in the Minsk Package. We call on all sides to comply urgently with this provision.

Moreover, we call on Russia to respect its international commitments, including those in the OSCE, and release without further delay all illegally detained Ukrainian citizens both in Russia and on the illegally annexed Crimean peninsula, including Oleh Sentsov, Oleksandr Kolchenko and Ahtem Çiygöz.

We underline that Russia bears responsibility for the health, wellbeing and observance of the human rights of all persons it detains. We will continue to follow these cases very closely and to attend the trial of Nadiya Savchenko. Indeed, yesterday's worldwide #FreeSavchenko action day showed that many governments and communities both within the OSCE and outside it as well as the public at large continue to take a close interest in this case.

The Candidate Countries the FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC OF MACEDONIA\*, MONTENEGRO\* and ALBANIA\*, the Country of the Stabilisation and Association Process and Potential Candidate BOSNIA and HERZEGOVINA, and the EFTA country ICELAND, member of the European Economic Area, as well as UKRAINE, the REPUBLIC OF MOLDOVA, GEORGIA and SAN MARINO align themselves with this statement.
