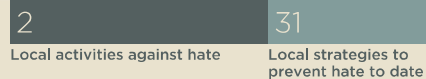

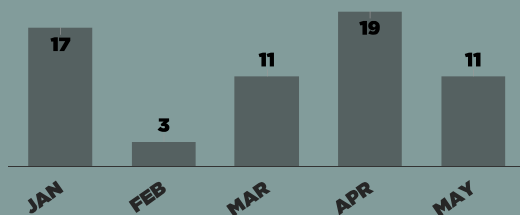

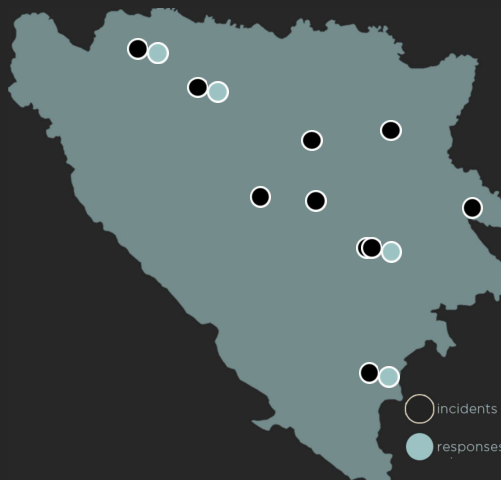

In May, a students' conference in Tuzla, titled Media for an Understanding Society: Reporting Without Stereotypes, brought together students and professionals from across BiH.
