Monitoring of Temporary Detention Facilities of the Kyrgyz Republic Internal Affairs Bodies in 2016-2018 Report by the Coalition against Torture in Kyrgyzstan



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TEMPORARY DETENTION FACILITIES (TDFS) MONITORING COVERAGE.

Between 2016 and 2018, the monitoring programme of the Coalition against Torture covered all TDFs of the Kyrgyz Republic.

Reference:

The Kyrgyz Republic Ministry of Internal Affairs administrates 46 TDFs with 259 cells and 1,217 beds. The actual occupancy rate is 1,374 people. Built between 1960s and 1980s, many TDFs do not meet international standards and sanitation and hygiene requirements.¹


Number of TDFs visited by member organizations of the Coalition against Torture in charge of the monitoring programme






During the reporting period (from 2016 to 2018), access of Coalition monitoring team experts to TDFs and persons detained in custody was obstructed 11 times.

Obstruction of access to TDFs




Monitoring groups interviewed 1,723 persons detained in TDFs, which is two thirds (66.6%) of the total number of individuals that were kept in TDFs at the time of 1,018 monitoring visits.



TORTURE ALLEGATIONS RECEIVED BY MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS OF THE COALITION AGAINST TORTURE

During the monitoring, TDF detainees submitted 140 allegations of torture.



Torture allegations received by member organizations of the Coalition against Torture






The analysis of data on persons who reported the use of torture revealed the following:




The ethnic composition of complainants remained virtually unchanged throughout the reporting period:










The most common torture method is beating with arms, legs or various objects on body parts. In every third case, torture is accompanied by handcuffing and putting on a plastic bag or a gas mask on the head, which results in the blocking of air access. In every tenth of the reported torture cases, the victim was exposed to a stun gun.








FOR COMPARISON: STATISTICAL DATA OF THE GENERAL PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE ON TORTURE AND CRUEL TREATMENT ALLEGATIONS

According to the Kyrgyz Republic Prosecutor General's Office of the Kyrgyz Republic, officers of internal affairs bodies were reported as torturers in 1,076 (94.6%) out of 1,140 allegations of torture and other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment registered in 2016-2018.²

Noteworthy is that in nine cases out of ten torture is used to coerce a confession of a crime.

The analysis showed that torture victims are mostly those who are suspected and later accused of committing crimes against property (theft, etc.), life and health (killing, causing bodily harm, etc.), public safety (hooliganism, etc.).

Charges brought against alleged torture victims

58%

crimes against property (fraud, theft, robbery, etc.)

The above leads to a finding that the highest percentage of torture victims is represented by persons who are suspected of committing crimes against property that imply criminal sanctions.



LEGAL ASSISTANCE PROVIDED TO ALLEGED TORTURE VICTIMS



The professional work of Coalition lawyers and attorneys who provide assistance to alleged torture victims resulted in the institution of 20 criminal cases, including:





under Article 305-1 of the KR Criminal Code (Torture)



under Article 304 (Abuse of office) and Article 305 (Exceeding official powers) of the KR Criminal Code.







Judicial review of criminal cases filed and investigated within the framework of the legal assistance provided by the Coalition against Torture resulted in 11 convictions against 20 officials, with 2 of them being convicted of and punished for torture.
