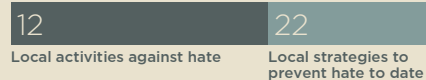

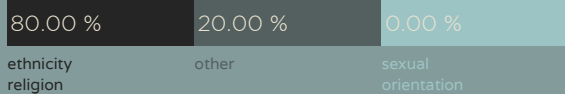

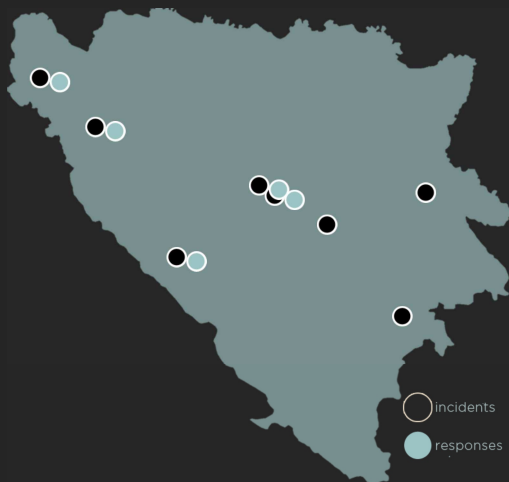

### Highlighted

In May, CaHs marked the World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development at 16 locations across BiH through online events including video productions, the presentation of an interactive map of Jajce, an online roundtable and TV and radio shows. These activities aimed to convey positive messages promoting multiculturalism and raising awareness on cultural heritage and values in building social cohesion.
