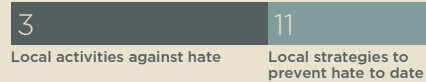

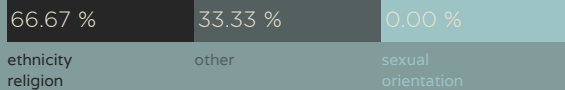

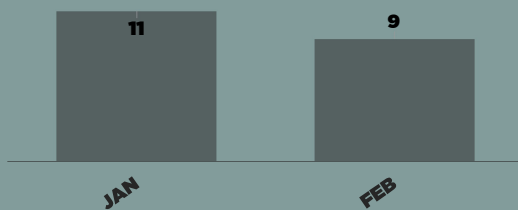

The Teočak Coalition against Hate organized a cross-municipal youth event with workshops for 200 young people from the municipalities of Teočak, Sapna, Lopare and Ugljevik on topics related to various types of hate incidents and their prevention. The event included an exhibition presented by the Anne Frank House in Amsterdam in co-operation with the BiH Youth Initiative for Human Rights (YIHR).
