EU closing remarks

- 1. The European Union and its Member States would like to thank the panellists, the Irish Chairmanship and the OCEEA who have contributed to the productive and stimulating deliberations over the 2 days of the meeting.
- The discussions have confirmed that corruption remains a big challenge for all our societies and that in spite of existence of relevant international instruments, a lot of efforts still need to be done in order to reduce, if not completely eradicate corruption.
- 3. No magic solution exists but it is clear that stronger political will and commitment is needed, as well as appropriate capacity building, training, enhancing internal legislation and international cooperation.
- 4. We support the efforts of the main multilateral organizations, such as UN, OECD and Council of Europe, as well as engagement of the OSCE in promoting good governance, in particular through its field operations.
- 5. We would like to reiterate the important role for civil society and private sector in fighting corruption.
