

In August, the OSCE Mission to Bosnia and Herzegovina supported the Zvornik youth NGO "ZUM" in implementing an online survey on prejudices among local youth. Forty-one respondents provided baseline data to guide future activities. The results, which also reflect key elements of newly adopted Community Cohesion Action Plan, prioritize the prevention of hate speech and prejudicemotivated incidents and will communicated interested audiences.

The Hate Monitor provides an update on all potential hate-motivated incidents and responses known to the OSCE Mission to BiH at the time of publishing the report.
