



**An Intervention before the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE)  
Participating States and Office of Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR)  
At the Human Dimension Implementation Meeting (HDIM), Warsaw, Poland  
Working Session 12: Rights of Migrants  
September 18, 2018**

According to OSCE modalities, this part of the Meeting is “devoted to forward-looking discussions with a view to...refining and – if necessary including...to meet new risks and challenges – further developing OSCE commitments.”<sup>1</sup>

Secure Freedom believes it is necessary to further develop OSCE commitments with respect to rights of migrants.

Those commitments rightly include, “promotion of the integration of legally resident migrant workers in host societies and the encouragement of their active participation in integration processes.”<sup>2</sup> (Budapest 1994).

But the 1994 Budapest agreement also “underline[d] the right of migrant workers to express freely their ethnic, cultural, religious and linguistic characteristics.”<sup>3</sup>

Dreaming up a mythical “right” of migrant workers to express freely their ethnic, cultural, religious and linguistic characteristics is the *opposite* of promoting their integration.

That provision was instead in keeping with the then-widely embraced concept of multiculturalism.

By 2010, pro-migrant<sup>4</sup> German Chancellor Angela Merkel denounced multiculturalism as having “utterly failed.”<sup>5</sup>

By 2011, anti-Brexit<sup>6</sup> British Prime Minister David Cameron had likewise concluded that:

Under the doctrine of state multiculturalism, we have encouraged different cultures to live separate lives, apart from each other and apart from the mainstream. We've failed to provide a vision of society to which they feel they want to belong. We've even tolerated these segregated communities behaving in ways that run completely counter to our values.<sup>7</sup>

Merkel and Cameron's catastrophic cataclysms since have proven both correct.

The question this raises is why the Italian OSCE Chairmanship decided to focus on the rights of migrants, rather than the Budapest document's "concern at mass migratory movements...including millions of refugees and displaced persons, due mainly to war, armed conflict, civil strife and grave human rights violations."<sup>8</sup>

Accordingly, Secure Freedom recommends:

1. That OSCE participating states revisit commitments to "the right of migrant workers to express freely their ethnic, cultural, religious and linguistic characteristics," to recognize instead multiculturalism's utter failure and the value of integration and unity or repatriation instead;<sup>9</sup> and
2. That it is necessary in order to meet new risks and challenges to further develop OSCE commitments with respect to rights of migrants, and thus that the incoming Slovakian Chairmanship, and all those in the agenda-setting process for it, choose to focus on commitments to address "concern at mass migratory movements" (Budapest 1994).<sup>10</sup>

**Recommendations to Accompany  
An Intervention before the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE)  
Participating States and Office of Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR)  
At the Human Dimension Implementation Meeting (HDIM), Warsaw, Poland  
Working Session 12: Rights of Migrants  
September 18, 2018**

According to OSCE Permanent Council Decision No. 476 of May 23, 2002, which lays out the modalities for OSCE Meetings on Human Dimension Issues:

The second part of the Human Dimension Implementation Meeting will be devoted to forward-looking discussions with a view to fostering implementation of, as well as to refining and – if necessary including in order to meet new risks and challenges – further developing OSCE commitments.<sup>1</sup>

Secure Freedom believes that it is necessary in order to meet new risks and challenges to further develop OSCE commitments with respect to rights of migrants.

Specifically, the draft agenda asserts that participating States have recognized that “protection and promotion of the rights of legal resident migrant workers and their family members have a human dimension.”<sup>2</sup> (Copenhagen 1990)

It also focuses in particular on “migrant workers and the integration of legal migrants.”<sup>3</sup>

Note that the document stipulates *legal migrant workers*.

Unfortunately, too many in the OSCE region are pushing to condone *illegal migrant non-workers*, including those who say openly that they seek to impose the totalitarian system of Sharia upon OSCE participating States.

In particular, in Copenhagen, the then-Conference on Security and Co-operation in Europe (CSCE) meeting took place in the wake of the fall of the Berlin Wall, as the Iron Curtain crumbled into rust.<sup>4</sup>

The participating states thus welcomed “with great satisfaction the fundamental political changes that have occurred in Europe since” 1989.<sup>5</sup>

In particular, CSCE welcomed “the commitment expressed by all participating States to the ideals of democracy and political pluralism as well as their common determination to build democratic societies based on free elections and the rule of law.”<sup>6</sup>

At that time, participating States “reaffirm[ed] that the protection and promotion of the rights of migrant workers have their human dimension.”<sup>7</sup>

Specifically, CSCE:

1. Agreed that “the protection and promotion of the rights of migrant workers are the concern of all participating States”<sup>8</sup>
2. “[Reaffirmed] their commitment to implement fully in their domestic legislation the rights of migrant workers provided for in international agreements to which they are parties”<sup>9</sup>
3. “[Considered] that, in future international instruments concerning the rights of migrant workers, they should take into account the fact that this issue is of importance for all of them”;<sup>10</sup> and
4. “[Expressed] their readiness to examine, at future CSCE meetings, the relevant aspects of the further promotion of the rights of migrant workers and their families.”<sup>11</sup>

Notice again that even at the time, CSCE singled out migrant *workers*.

According to the draft annotated agenda for this meeting, further commitments included, *inter alia*, “promotion of the integration of legally resident migrant workers in host societies and the encouragement of their active participation in integration processes (Budapest 1994, Madrid 2007).”<sup>12</sup>

It is true that the CSCE’s 1994 Budapest agreement, “TOWARDS A GENUINE PARTNERSHIP IN A NEW ERA,” does stipulate that participating States:

...will continue to promote the integration of migrant workers in the societies in which they are lawfully residing. They recognize that a successful process of integration also depends on its active pursuit by the migrants themselves and decided therefore to encourage them in this regard.<sup>13</sup>

On the other hand, Budapest also “underline[d] the right of migrant workers to express freely their ethnic, cultural, religious and linguistic characteristics,” though it qualified that “the exercise of such rights may be subject to such restrictions as are prescribed by law and consistent with international standards.”<sup>14</sup>

Still, dreaming up a mythical right of migrant workers to express freely their ethnic, cultural, religious and linguistic characteristics is the *opposite* of promoting their integration.

It was instead in keeping with the then-widely embraced concept of multiculturalism.

By 2010, pro-migrant<sup>15</sup> German Chancellor Angela Merkel denounced multiculturalism as having “utterly failed.”<sup>16</sup>

By 2011, anti-Brexit<sup>17</sup> British Prime Minister David Cameron had likewise concluded that:

Under the doctrine of state multiculturalism, we have encouraged different cultures to live separate lives, apart from each other and apart from the mainstream. We’ve failed to provide a vision of society to which they feel they want to belong. We’ve even tolerated these segregated communities behaving in ways that run completely counter to our values.<sup>18</sup>

Merkel and Cameron's catastrophic cataclysms since have proven both correct.

This in turn raises the fact that CSCE also determined in Budapest that "appropriate measures should be taken to better prevent racist attacks and other manifestations of violent intolerance against migrant workers and their families."

That is ironic, given that seven years later, on 9/11, 19 "migrants" murdered 2,753 men, women and children in the attack on the Twin Towers alone.<sup>19</sup> Twenty percent of Americans knew someone hurt or killed by "migrants" that day.<sup>20</sup> Three thousand fifty one children lost a parent to those 19 migrants, and eight children lost their lives,<sup>21</sup> including David Brandhorst-Gamboa, age 3, whose photo appears below:

Since 9/11, of 580 individuals convicted of terrorism in the United States, a towering 380, more than 65%, were "migrants," that is, foreign-born, according to documents released by then-members of the U.S. Senate

Judiciary Committee.<sup>22</sup> Given that migrants made up only 12.9% of the U.S. population in 2010, migrants were more than four times as likely to be convicted of terrorism than native-born Americans. (See Table 1)

Likewise in Europe, EUROPOL has assessed that Islamic State “exploited the flow of refugees and migrants to send individuals to Europe to commit acts of terrorism, which became evident in the 2015 Paris attacks.”<sup>23</sup>

By 2016, jihadis killed more than 95% of the European men, women and children slaughtered in terrorist attacks that year.<sup>24</sup> Foreign citizens made up only 7.5% of those living in EU Member States on January 1, 2017.<sup>25</sup>

Perhaps in Budapest, participating States should have decided that appropriate measures should be taken to better prevent attacks and other manifestations of violent intolerance by migrants and their families.

These figures also raise the question why the Italian OSCE Chairmanship decided to focus on the rights of migrants, rather than the Budapest document’s “concern at mass migratory movements in the CSCE region, including millions of refugees and displaced persons, due mainly to war, armed conflict, civil strife and grave human rights violations.”<sup>26</sup>

Secure Freedom challenges participating States and ODIHR staff who wish to focus on the rights of migrants:

1. Was little 3-year-old David Brandhorst-Gamboia, who was flown into a building along with everyone on United Airlines Flight 175, not part of the human dimension?
2. Do you no longer care about mass migratory movements? Does terrorism, crime, and the creeping imposition of Sharia not have a human dimension?
3. Do you sneer at those pleading in the streets for your country to expel illegal immigrants who embrace the most blood-thirsty ideology of all time?
4. How many armed guards protect your workplace as you sit in meetings rolling your eyes at those without armed guards desperate for your help to protect their families?
5. Are you one of the elites smearing your fellow human beings pouring into the streets to beg you to stop packing their communities with murderers as – Nazis?

I would like to cite an expert in Nazism on this matter: Adolph Hitler, whom I utterly loathe:

‘It’s been our misfortune to have the wrong religion,’ Hitler once complained. “Why did it have to be Christianity, with its meekness and flabbiness?”

Hitler said, Islam was a “religion of men.” The “soldiers of Islam” received “a real earthly paradise” with “wine flowing.”

This, Hitler argued, was much more suited to the “Germanic temperament” than the “Jewish filth and priestly twaddle” of Christianity.<sup>27</sup>

So who are the Nazis here:

Parents and children at Trump rallies cheering for someone for finally says “Radical Islamic terrorism”?

Germans protesting in the streets of Chemnitz that yet another Sharia-supremacist migrant stabbed yet another German?

National security experts and local activists trying desperately to warn you that Sharia requires those who follow it to murder Jews and Christians alike until they pay tribute and are humbled?<sup>28</sup>

Or – those who want to focus on the rights of migrants, even when those migrants want to do the murdering?

To answer that question, I would further like to cite an expert in Sharia: Haj Amin al-Husseini, the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, who met with Hitler in November, 1941. At that meeting:

The Mufti offered Hitler his “thanks for the sympathy which he had always shown for the Arab and especially Palestinian cause, and to which he had given clear expression in his public

speeches....The Arabs were Germany's natural friends because they had the same enemies as had Germany, namely....the Jews....”<sup>29</sup>

Ask yourself: Are you more expert on Nazism than Hitler?

Are you more expert on Sharia than the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem?

If not, it might be wise to explore the possibility that both were right, and what you are being told by those with a vested interest in you thinking they were wrong is wrong.

Ask yourself this question on the rights of migrants: Does it *really* make you a better person to endlessly repeat the same tired rhetoric about it?

We know that after 9/11 the OSCE Ministerial Council “[f]irmly reject[ed] identification of terrorism with any nationality or religion”.<sup>30</sup>

We also know the Ministerial Council “reaffirm[ed] that action against terrorism is not aimed against any religion, nation or people.”<sup>31</sup>

However, innocent human beings are almost certainly dead today because OSCE diplomats took that approach. Maybe hundreds of them. Maybe thousands of them. Maybe tens of thousands of them.

Why?

Because while the OSCE Ministerial Council was firmly rejecting identification of terrorism with any religion, and carefully making sure action against terrorism is not aimed against any religion, Sharia’s fanatical followers were screaming in the streets that they firmly identified *themselves* with terror, based on at least nine Qur’an verses:

1. Qur’an, Chapter 8: Verse 60: “Against them make ready your strength to the utmost of your power, including steeds of war, to strike **terror** into (the hearts of) the enemies, of Allah and your enemies, and others besides, whom ye may not know, but whom Allah doth know.”<sup>32</sup>
2. Qur’an, Chapter 3: Verse 151: “Soon shall We cast **terror** into the hearts of the Unbelievers, for that they joined companions with Allah, for which He had sent no authority: their abode will be the Fire.”<sup>33</sup>

3. Qur'an, Chapter 59: Verse 2: "It is He Who got out the Unbelievers among the People of the Book from their homes at the first gathering (of the forces). Little did ye think that they would get out: And they thought that their fortresses would defend them from Allah! But the (Wrath of) Allah came to them from quarters from which they little expected (it), and cast **terror** into their hearts, so that they destroyed their dwellings by their own hands and the hands of the Believers, take warning, then, O ye with eyes (to see)!"<sup>34</sup>
4. Qur'an, Chapter 52: Verse 45: "leave them alone until they encounter that Day of theirs, wherein they shall (perforce) swoon (with **terror**)"<sup>35</sup>
5. Qur'an, Chapter 59: Verse 13: "ye are stronger (than they) because of the **terror** in their hearts, (sent) by Allah."<sup>36</sup>
6. Qur'an, Chapter 33: Verse 26: "And those of the People of the Book who aided them - Allah did take them down from their strongholds and cast **terror** into their hearts. (So that) some ye slew, and some ye made prisoners."<sup>37</sup>
7. Qur'an, Chapter 34: Verse 51: "If thou couldst but see when they will quake with **terror**; but then there will be no escape (for them)."<sup>38</sup>
8. Qur'an, Chapter 2: Verse 19: "(another similitude) is that of a rain-laden cloud from the sky: In it are zones of darkness, and thunder and lightning: They press their fingers in their ears to keep out the stunning thunder-clap, the while they are in **terror** of death. But Allah is ever round the rejecters of Faith!"<sup>39</sup>
9. Qur'an, Chapter 8: Verse 12: "Remember thy Lord inspired the angels (with the message): I am with you: give firmness to the Believers: I will instil **terror** into the hearts of the Unbelievers: smite ye above their necks and smite all their finger-tips off them."<sup>40</sup>

Secure Freedom is aware of the primary rebuttals to such an argument: Those verses are out of context. Christianity has them too. Islam is a religion of peace. There are many Sharias.

Yet if those verses are out of context, and Christianity has them too, and Islam is a religion of peace, and there are many Sharias, then why have 270 million people died over 1,400 years at the hands of those fighting in the way of Allah to impose an Islamic State under Sharia?<sup>41</sup>

Why did Al-Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent, or [AQS](#), just release a [document that](#) "lays down a new code of conduct for jihadists all over the world to follow," [put together in cooperation with Al Qaeda core](#),

that [makes plain](#) “one purpose of *jihad* is breaking the might of *Kufr* (Infidelity [non-Muslims]) and establishing *Shari’ah*, while another is guidance, protection, and welfare of the Muslims”?

Why 17 years after 9/11 – and 1400 years after the birth of *jihad*, does Al Qaeda’s goal remain killing non-Muslims, and “protecting” Muslims, apparently by imposing brutal, medieval Sharia on both?

At this meeting, you have arguably the American military’s former top expert on Sharia as a threat doctrine.

Now he is no longer the military’s top expert, because an official I believe was a hostile asset got him ousted for speaking the truth.

America: Please, listen to him, as you once did, including about the rights of migrants.

At this meeting, you have a survivor of the revolution in Tehran and the invasion of Kuwait, who was in North Africa on 9/11, whose husband jihadis had at gunpoint ready to massacre, twice.

Now Austria has convicted her of demeaning a recognized religion for speaking the truth.

Austria: Shame on you. Quit hiding behind so-called “hate speech” laws, which are tools to repress dissent from insane elite policies on the rights of migrants that allow them to preen while those without security details die. Your new government claims to understand that. Change your laws.

At this meeting, you have a Turkish dissident whom I believe would be in danger for her life were she to return to her native country, for speaking the truth.

Turkey: Show the courage to face your critics, without imprisoning, torturing, or killing them.

Accordingly, Secure Freedom recommends:

1. That the United States of America continue to put the rights of its citizens over the rights of migrants, especially criminal illegal aliens, murderers, rapists, drug dealers, and those who seek to impose Sharia by any means necessary, and that every other participating State begin to do the same;
2. That Austria follow through on its commitments to enact and enforce similar measures, and immediately amend its laws allowing current prosecution of those who speak truth, including on Sharia;
3. That Turkey be excluded from OSCE consensus decision-making until such time as its regime has the courage to be in the same room with its critics without imprisoning or torturing them; and finally,
4. That OSCE participating states revisit commitments to “the right of migrant workers to express freely their ethnic, cultural, religious and linguistic characteristics,” to recognize instead multiculturalism’s utter failure and the value of integration and unity or repatriation instead;<sup>42</sup> and
5. That it is necessary in order to meet new risks and challenges to further develop OSCE commitments with respect to rights of migrants, and thus that:
  - a. The incoming Slovakian OSCE Chairmanship, and all those in the agenda-setting process for it, choose focus on OSCE commitments to address “concern at mass migratory

movements” (Budapest 1994)<sup>43</sup> and the rights of OSCE region native-born populations, rather than *facilitating* mass migratory movements and focusing on the rights of migrants who are disproportionately convicted of terrorist crimes in America, and/or jihadis, who kill an ever-more-wildly disproportionate share of Europeans; and

- b. That the OSCE Ministerial Council replace the Porto 2002 OSCE CHARTER ON PREVENTING AND COMBATING TERRORISM,” p. 9, paragraph 2 with a measure that acknowledges that today by far and away the greatest driver of what the West calls terrorism, as well as of the loss of the rights of migrants and all other citizens as well, is the totalitarian Islamic program known as Sharia.
