

**Basic elements of input by Mr. Takeshi KAMIYAMA, Deputy Chief of Mission,
Minister, Embassy of Japan, on the occasion of the 2010 Review Conference
(Economic cluster of the EED)**

1. Coverage associated with “Transport Security”

The latest EEF process focused on “Promoting good governance at border crossings, improving the security of land transportation and facilitating international transport by road and rail in the OSCE region.”
