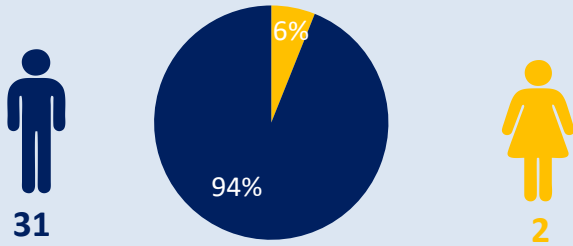


Municipal Community Safety Councils

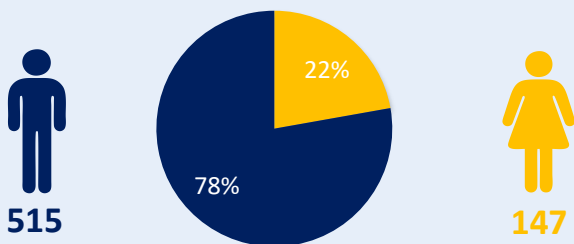
The OSCE Mission in Kosovo supports institutions mandated to address communities' security concerns. To assist in this effort, the Mission regularly monitors the performance of Municipal Community Safety Councils (MCSCs). This information sheet aims to provide the relevant institutions with indicators that can assist in identifying gaps and improving compliance.

The MCSCs are established under the Ministry of Internal Affairs Administrative Instruction No. 27/2012 and the Ministry of Local Government Administrative Instruction No. 03/2012. MCSCs are created to improve communities' safety and security and aim to include a broad, gender-balanced, inclusive membership of all ethnic and religious communities in the municipality who play a role in the communities' well-being. As of February 2023, 33 MCSCs are established in Kosovo (see the list of MCSCs in next page).

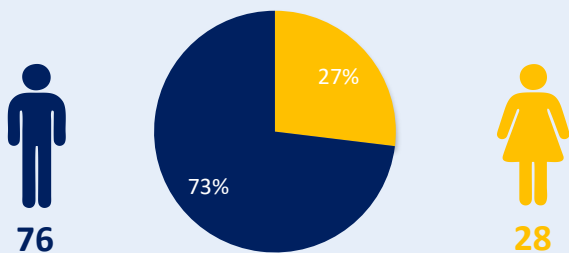
Representation of women and men as the chairperson of the MCSC



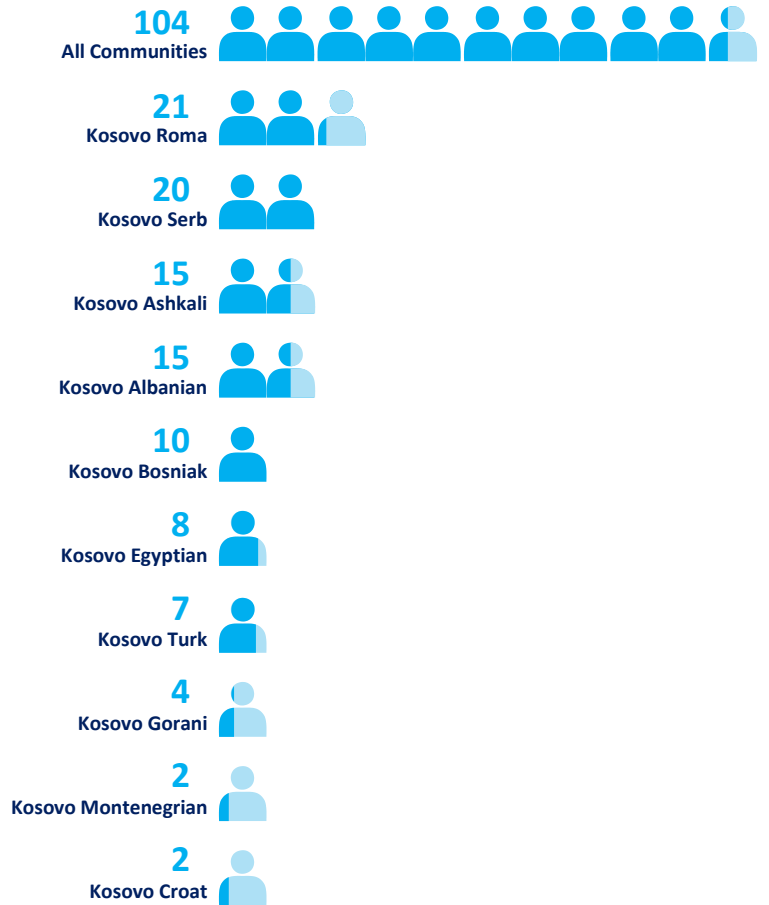
Representation of women and men in the total MCSCs membership

Number of MCSCs lacking community representation*

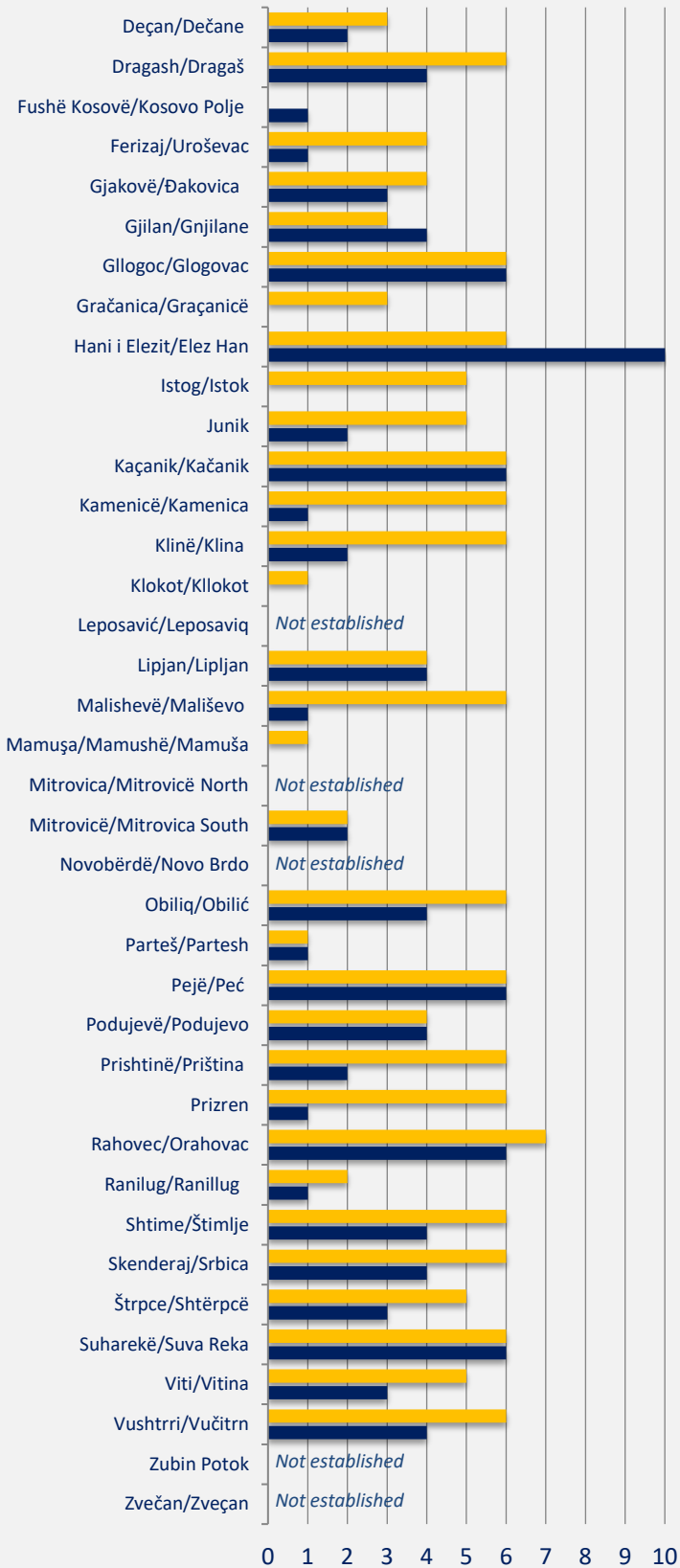

Performance and Functioning in 2022

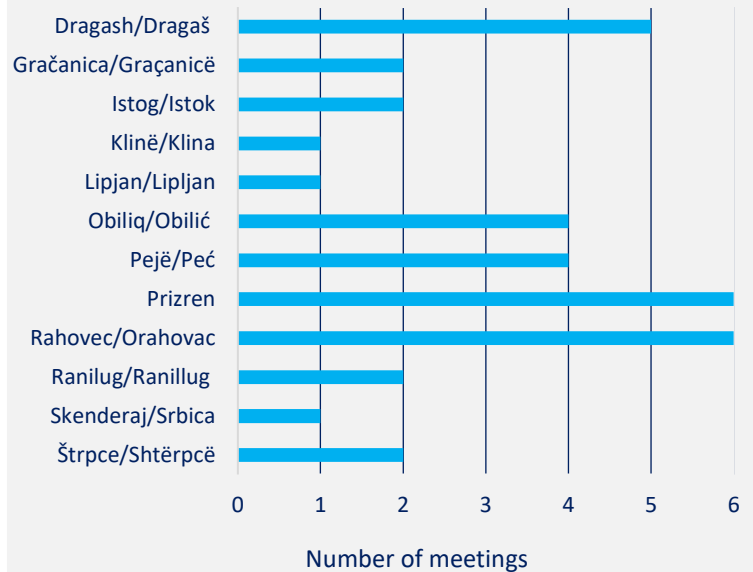
Number of meetings held in 2022

Six meetings annually are required by Administrative Instruction 27/2012 and 03/2012

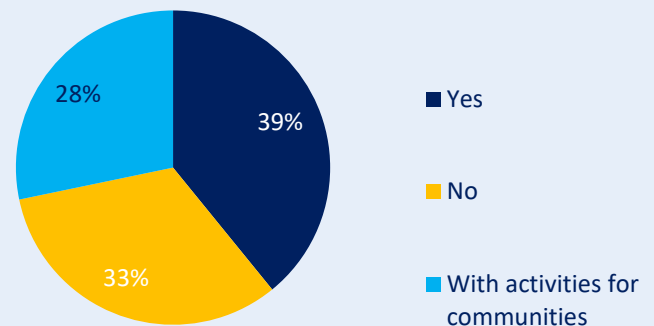
