Short biography

Dr Pal Dunay is currently Head of the International Security Programme and Director of the International Training Course in Security Policy at the Geneva Centre for Security Policy. He holds a Ph.D. in international relations from the Budapest University of Economics, also a “dr. universitatis” degree in public international law from the Loránd Eötvös University in Budapest and became “doctor juris” in Law and Political Sciences also at the Loránd Eötvös University. His main research interest is focused on different aspects of European security, including security and military developments in Eastern Europe, the security of East Central Europe, and conventional arms control. The results of this interest are reflected in his publications. This includes five books as author or co-author, 14 edited volumes and approximately 170 journal articles and book chapters. Currently, Dr Dunay works on two main research projects on “Pre-emption and prevention in international relations and under international law since the end of the Cold War”, and “Hungarian foreign policy between 1990 and 2004.” During the last two decades, Mr. Dunay attended approximately 160 international conferences in most cases as paper giver or commentator. It is also worth mentioning the fact that Pal Dunay has been among the editors of the OSZE-Jahrbuch since 1995.
