It fosters the widest possible co-operation and exchange of information between PIUs based on reciprocity or mutual agreement and following commonly agreed principles and rules. The OSCE has launched the Eastern European IWG in co-operation with UNOCT and will work with the OSCE pS that are not part of the EU IWG. The EE IWG will be a platform for discussing the latest developments and challenges for air and maritime passenger information. 	<p>Sub-working group chairs</p> <p><i>The chairs of the sub-working groups will oversee the work of the four different sub-working groups (Legal, Operational, Transport Industry Engagement and ICT and interoperability). The chairs should be rotated, while ensuring the continuation of the work.
