ODIHR Data protection policy

The OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) is committed to being transparent about how it collects and uses personal data and that the processing of such data is in accordance with OSCE's internal policies on Personal Data Protection and treated by the OSCE as restricted information.

By registering for the webinar "Addressing the psychological needs of hate crime victims through a trauma-informed approach" organized by ODIHR, you agree and consent to the collection and processing of your personal data. The personal data collected during registration for this event is the following mandatory data:

Name, surname, e-mail address and gender

The data provided during the registration process is collected and processed by the OSCE for the specific purpose of establishing a list of registrants wishing to participate in the webinar, sending updates/notifications concerning the webinar, as well as any possible follow up after the webinar, such as sending additional materials or evaluation surveys to the participants, and also establishing the gender balance of the webinar.

The data will be collected and processed in line with OSCE's mandate and legal obligation towards the donor and also based on your consent.

Personal data will be retained only for as long as it is necessary for the specified purposes for which the data were collected and processed before being anonymized, deleted or destroyed.

Anonymized personal data captured at the ODIHR-organized webinar "Addressing the psychological needs of hate crime victims through a trauma-informed approach" may be used for donor reporting purposes and stored for up to five years after project completion.

In the absence of your consent, your registration to the project cannot be completed and ODIHR will not use your personal data in the framework of this project.
