Intervention by the Delegation of the Arab Republic of Egypt H.E Ambassador Soliman Awaad

Mr. Chairman,

Having listened to the inspiring statements during the inaugural session, my delegation is more convinced than ever of the crucial importance of this OSCE event in Brussels. It represents a cornerstone in promoting tolerance and combating racism, xenophobia, and discrimination.

We are all in the same boat, and it will serve our best interest to contribute to the full success of this conference. Such success is conditional to addressing all forms, kinds, acts and manifestations of intolerance, racism, xenophobia and discrimination even-handedly in a comprehensive, balanced, and non-selective approach. Anti-Semitism and anti-Moslem sentiments are two major problems with very particular specificity.

The surge in anti-Arab and anti-Muslim and Islamophobic trends in the aftermath of the September 11th terrorist attacks have to be addressed adequately and on the same footing.
