On the occasion of the European Union Anti-Trafficking Day, the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) jointly with the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women) will host a webinar to discuss the policy recommendations report on “Addressing Emerging Human Trafficking Trends and Consequences of the COVID-19 Pandemic” and its briefs. The report is based on empirical data collected from survivors of trafficking from 40 countries and frontline organizations from 102 countries.
