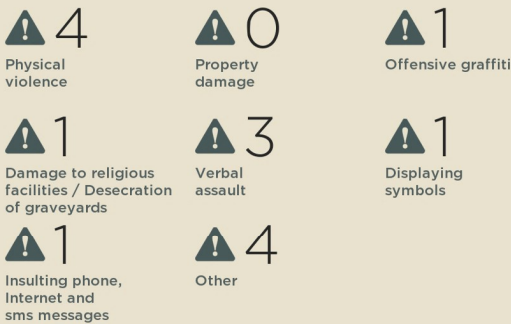

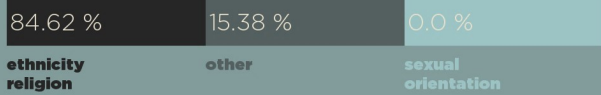

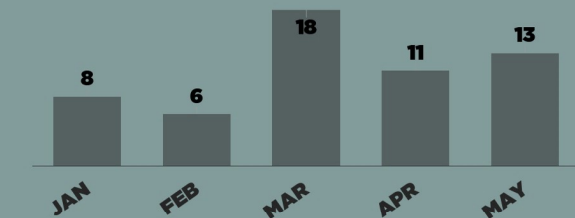

#### Highlighted

On 10 May, the Coalition against Hate from Višegrad strongly condemned an incident in which gunshots were fired from a convoy of moving vehicles in the direction of the president of the association Women Victims of War. Members of the Coalition invited relevant institutions to find the perpetrators, especially since the person targeted by the attack is a victim and witness of war crimes committed in the Višegrad area.
