



WATER CONSUMERS ASSOCIATIONS IN UZBEKISTAN

- Citizens of Uzbekistan may voluntarily form water consumers associations (WCA) designated as non-governmental non-profit organizations created by water consumers and acting as legal entities to coordinate water relations, as well as to provide representation and protection of common interests.
- The founders may be farms or cooperative farms and other water consumers.
- The members are farms, self-government bodies and others.
- Up to year of 2015, 1,502 of WCAs operate in the country.
- The area served by the WCA is 3964.16 thousand hectares.
- WCA provide services to 63,010 water users, of which 55,867 are farms.
- The number of service staff is 10,163 people, including 5,294 hydraulic engineers.









RAISING PUBLIC AWARENESS ABOUT THE RISKS OF EMERGENCIES RELATED TO WATER

- Learning materials, memos and brochures for population
- Early warning systems:
- Informing the population through public telecommunication networks of the possibility of emergencies related to water (sms mailing).
- Mobile applications (App Store, Google Play).
- Regular trainings for population, as well as officers and engineers on water facilities
- Rescuers' Public Clubs

Challenges and target programmes

• Water scarcity and the Aral Sea disaster

• Further decrease in river flow in the upper reaches of the Amy Darya and Syr Darya as a result of melting of glaciers in the Tien Shan

• Drinking water consumption and sanitation first and foremost

• Implementation of national projects on creation of small local reservoirs in the delta of Amu Darya river, construction of water intake facilities with desalination plants, protective forest plantations and ornithological monitoring in the southern part of the Aral Sea basin.
