STATEMENT

By Ambassador Vesko Garcevic, representative of Montenegro At the 687th meeting f the Permanent Council, 8th November 2007

Thank you, Mr. Chairman

Although my delegation has aligned with the Statement of the European Union, we would like to add few words in our national capacity.

My delegation warmly welcomes High Commissioner for national minorities, Ambassador Vollebaek in his first appearance at the Permanent Council in his new role and thanks him for his written and oral Report. We also welcome our dear colleague Ambassador Moran at today's PC meeting.

We welcome the positive assessment in the report regarding the process of adoption of the new Constitution of Montenegro, in which the Office of the High Commissioner has given its valuable support. Montenegro has demonstrated, throughout the years, its commitment and willingness to adopt and implement the highest international standards in protection of national minorities.
