BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Workflows for website maintenance:

CEE/CIS site:	Communication Officer submits, releases and publishes pages
Consultation site:	Consultant worked on behalf of Consultation Communication Working Group

Level of centralization:

CEE/CIS site: Site pulls in content from field offices in CEE/CIS and from thematic programme colleagues. Communication Officer is central point. Consultation site: Consultant pulled in inputs from wide range of partners to build a joint website, with joint decisions made on publishing.

Maintenance policies:

CEE/CIS site: Communication Officer maintains on a daily basis, but time is limited Consultation site: Under discussion to ensure that the site continues as a resource for the UN Secretary-General's Global Study on Children and Violence to be published in October 2006.

Approaches to redesign and setting up of sub-sites:

CEE/CIS site: Site complies with the RedDot template created by HQ and used by UNICEF offices worldwide. NY templaters constantly updating the template. Subsites: encouragement for field offices to develop their own RedDot sites. No redesign or sub-sites envisaged at present.

Skills needed:

- Communication skills
- Clear vision of web potential
- Creativity combined with logic

Solutions for special issues:

For discussion at this workshop – particularly fundraising mechanisms

Integration with information management system/branding:

CEE/CIS site:	UNICEF-wide template, reflects communication priorities, UNICEF branding
Consultation site:	Distinct site for specific purpose – has own branding.

Public vs. local audiences:

- CEE/CIS site: Aims to raise visibility of the youngest UNICEF region within the organization, as well as with members of the public. Major promotional campaign within UNICEF itself. More external promotion needed more reciprocal links, etc.
- Consultation site: Intended for anyone interested in the issue of Violence against Children, from government representatives to media to children.
