Local Expert in War Journalism and Military-Media Relations

"Supporting Conflict Sensitive Journalism in Ukraine" project

Background information:

Upon the request of the Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Education and Science, Commission of Journalistic Ethics, Independent Media Trade Union, and Institute of Mass Information, OSCE Project Coordinator in Ukraine (PCU) is implementing "Supporting Conflict Sensitive Journalism in Ukraine" Project. It is aimed to support the development of conflict-sensitive media coverage and journalists' safety in conflict areas. The Project will also facilitate a dialogue between media professionals and military officers by developing and delivery series of trainings on media relations for military personnel.

This training for the military officers will explain the role of the media in the conflict zone and strengthened mutual understanding, as well as create better working environment for the media professionals in the conflict area.

Task:

To implement the abovementioned trainings, PCU is seeking a local journalist with experience of reporting from the hostile zones and areas of conflict. The selected expert will work in co-operation with two other trainers: an international expert on strategic communications and work with the media in military service, and a local media lawyer.

More specifically, the Expert will be expected to:

- take part in November in five one-day trainings that are planned for senior military command in Mariupol, Kramatorsk, Kyiv, Vinnytsia and Odesa;
- prepare and deliver presentation on the role of journalists in times of conflict, and outline the best practices and strategies for efficient media communications;
- prepare relevant hand-outs for participants.

Qualifications:

- university degree in journalism, political or social sciences, or international relations;
- at least ten years of experience in journalism, with proven international record of covering armed conflicts and military operations;
- knowledge of current political and socio-cultural developments in CIS countries, particularly in Ukraine;
- experience in delivering lectures and presentations;
- excellent knowledge of Ukrainian and Russian;
- excellent knowledge of English;
- excellent communication skills;
- accuracy and diligence;
- computer literacy.



deadline for applications is 04 November 2015. Applications received after the published deadline will not be considered. Details of the assignment and contract may be further discussed during the interviews.
