

HEAD OF PRESENCE REMARKS - BIOMETRIC PASSPORT READER DONATION $28\,\mathit{June}~2012$

General Director Burgaj, Director Nako, Ladies and gentlemen,

It is a pleasure for me to be back again in the headquarters of the Albanian State Police for today's ceremony.

Border management is *also* about the freedom of citizens to travel in accordance with the law, for exchanging knowledge, ideas, or simply for vacations.

This side of border management is crucial for regional prosperity.

And it is so because it pertains to the flow of goods and people, a foundation of modern security and stability, including in the region of South Eastern Europe.

Here we come to the service aspect: correct and speedy professional service is much needed for the economic development of this region.

The good balance between assuring border security while allowing cross-border traffic, and therefore freedom of movement, needs to be found every day..

Clearly, border security requires, to begin with, committed professionals, with the required operational support and capacities.

With equal clarity, advanced technologies are nowadays essential for modern border management.

They help countering manifold threats such as organised crime, while enabling the human and economic progress, which stems from the free and safe flow of people and goods.

Today's handing over of 10 biometric passport readers, together with the related training, is an important concrete contribution to further improve the well performed operations of the Albanian State Police.

The machines and their operators will help to safe many hours of waiting at the border, while bringing better service and increased security.

I am deeply convinced that this contribution comes indeed timely, as the tourist season of summer 2012 is starting to run up to full swing.
