

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN IN FINLAND

- The surveys were carried out in autumn 1997 and 2005
- Postal inquiry
- Response rates: 70 % in 1997, 62 % in 2005
- Women aged 18 to 74
- 4,995 responses in 1997, 4,464 responses 2005
- 3,495 married or cohabiting women in 1997, 3,172 in 2005
- Men's violence against women asked
- Men classified as partners, ex-partners, other

Violence in current partnership

(life-time prevalence)

	1997	2005
Total	22.2	19.6 *
Threats	9.0	7.6
Physical violence	20.0	17.6
Sexual violence and threatening behaviour	5.9	4.3 *
(n=women in a partnership)	3,495	3,172

- •results differ at 95 % confidence level
- •prevalence since the beginning of the partnership

New questions on sexual violence are not included in 2005 results. Adding them increases the prevalence to 5.3 per cent (23 % increase), total victimization to 19.9 per cent.

Where women sought help to solve partner violence?


- Informal social support
 - 65 % talked about partner violence (56 % in 1997)
- Official support
 - 31 % sought help from official body or other helping agencies (26 % in 1997)
- The most serious case of violence
 - 10,1 % of the cases reported to police (9,4 % in 1997)
 - 13,7 % of women sought medical care (12,3 % in 1997)

"FULL TO THE BRIM"

To prevent violence against women in Porvoo 1999-2002

HOW IT BEGUN

- The national five-year (1998-2002) project for the prevention of violence against women and prostitution made the problem visible
- No adequate services available for women affected by violence in Porvoo
- The local family counselling centre convened key organisations to a meeting. A decision was made to start a local project for prevention of violence against women



THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

- 1. To enhance the capacity of different authorities to prevent, recognize and intervene with domestic violence
- 2. To give better help and support to victims and witnesses (children)
- To refer perpetrators to seek help for ending their violence
- 4. To establish a network between different organisations involved
- 5. To create an open discussion about violence against women in the community

IMPLEMENTATION 1/4

- Training; over 20 seminars were held, approximately 1050 participated
- All authorities involved, <u>devised own</u> <u>models</u> to detect and to intervene in domestic violence
- Improved shelter services for victims of violence. Now available 24-hour service

IMPLEMENTATION 2/4 Groups

- For female victims; open groups and close groups (10 meetings once a week)
- For victims of sexual violence
- For child witnesses of domestic violence
- For men help them to stop the violence

IMPLEMENTATION 3/4

- "Family preparing courses", informed about violence against women. High risk when pregnant or when the child is born
- Referral of cases from the police and prosecutor to the family counselling centre. A new way of working for both
- Pamphlet; information about violence against women and where to get help
- The local media informed well about the project and made the violence visible in the town of Porvoo

IMPLEMENTATION 4/4

 The City Board set up a multi-professional, cross-administrative task force to prevent violence between couples and in intimate relationships.

The purpose of the task force

- to draft a programme to prevent violence between couples and in intimate relationships,
- to monitor its implementations,
- to develop targeted services,
- to co-ordinate co-operation,
- to provide training to professionals,
- to manage information services and
- to provide expert help to various organisations.



Recommendations for the prevention of interpersonal and domestic violence. How to guide and lead local and regional activities in social and health care services

- In 2008

The objectives of the recommendations

1/2

- influence public attitudes to ensure that interpersonal and domestic violence is perceived as a serious problem that needs to be addressed in order to reduce the level of violence throughout the country
- help to develop structures and procedures to discourage interpersonal and domestic violence

The Objectives 2/2

- promote coordinated and determined cooperation in municipalities
- ensure that professionally managed and coordinated assistance and services are available within the social and health care system early enough, and for a sufficiently extensive period of time:
 - for those exposed to violence,
 - children and young people living in violent families and
 - the perpetrators.
