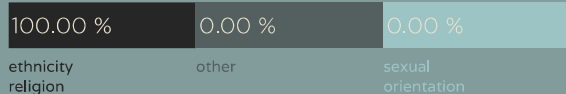

TYPES OF INCIDENTS

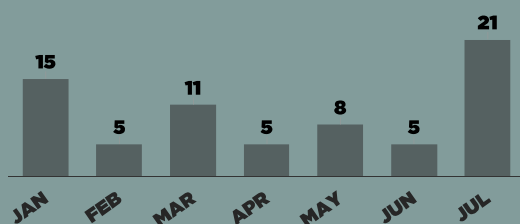


Incidents can consist of several acts.

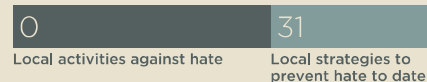

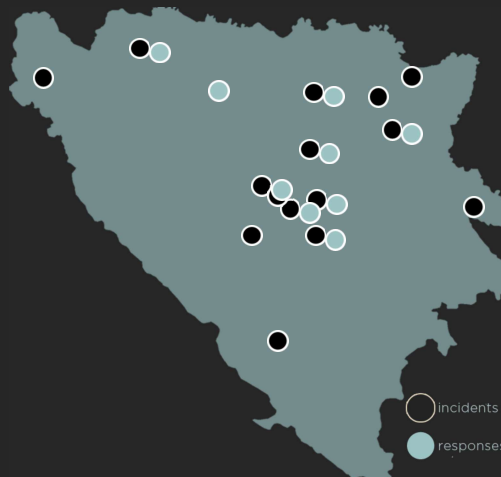

In July, the Mission supported the Srebrenica Youth School organized by the Post-Conflict Research Centre (PCRC) and the Srebrenica Memorial Centre, as well as an international PCRC conference. Participants examined transitional justice, dealing with the past, and genocide prevention. The Mission shared insights from 20 years of trial monitoring and underscored the role of youth, education, and civil society in reconciliation and peacebuilding.

The Hate Monitor provides an update on all potential hate-motivated incidents and responses known to the OSCE Mission to BiH at the time of publishing the report.
